ASK OTTAWA FOR MORE DATA ON MACHINERY

Victoria, June 11.—While awaiting further details in regard to the plans and specifications of the engines and auxiliary machinery for the ships contracted for in British Columbia by the Imperial Munitions Board, the board's representatives on this coast are negotiating daily with representatives of the British Columbia metal trades firms, and although no definite statement has so far been made, beyond that in all probability 12 sets would be built in the province, assurance has been given that all the auxiliary machinery for the vessels so far contracted for will be built in British Columbia.

The Victoria, Vancouver, Prince Rupert and New Westminster plants have appointed a joint committee to take the matter up with the Munitions Board, of which Mr. Bushby, president of the British Columbia Metal Trades Association, is chairman; Mr. Norman Yarrow, of Yarrow, Limited, being the representative for Victoria.

With regard to the engines the attitude of Mr. Buchart and Capt. Troup is that the British Columbia works will be given the fullest opportunity to build as many as they are able and the helpful manner is highly praised by the members of the Metal Trades Association.

THE NEW SMELTER

At the council meeting last evening, a letter from the Hon. Wm. Sloan, minister of mines, was read, which stated that in the locating and building of the proposed smelter and ore refining works, every consideration will be given to the facts as stated in the communication from the city, and that the fact that Prince Rupert was the centre of a large mining area cannot be gainsaid.

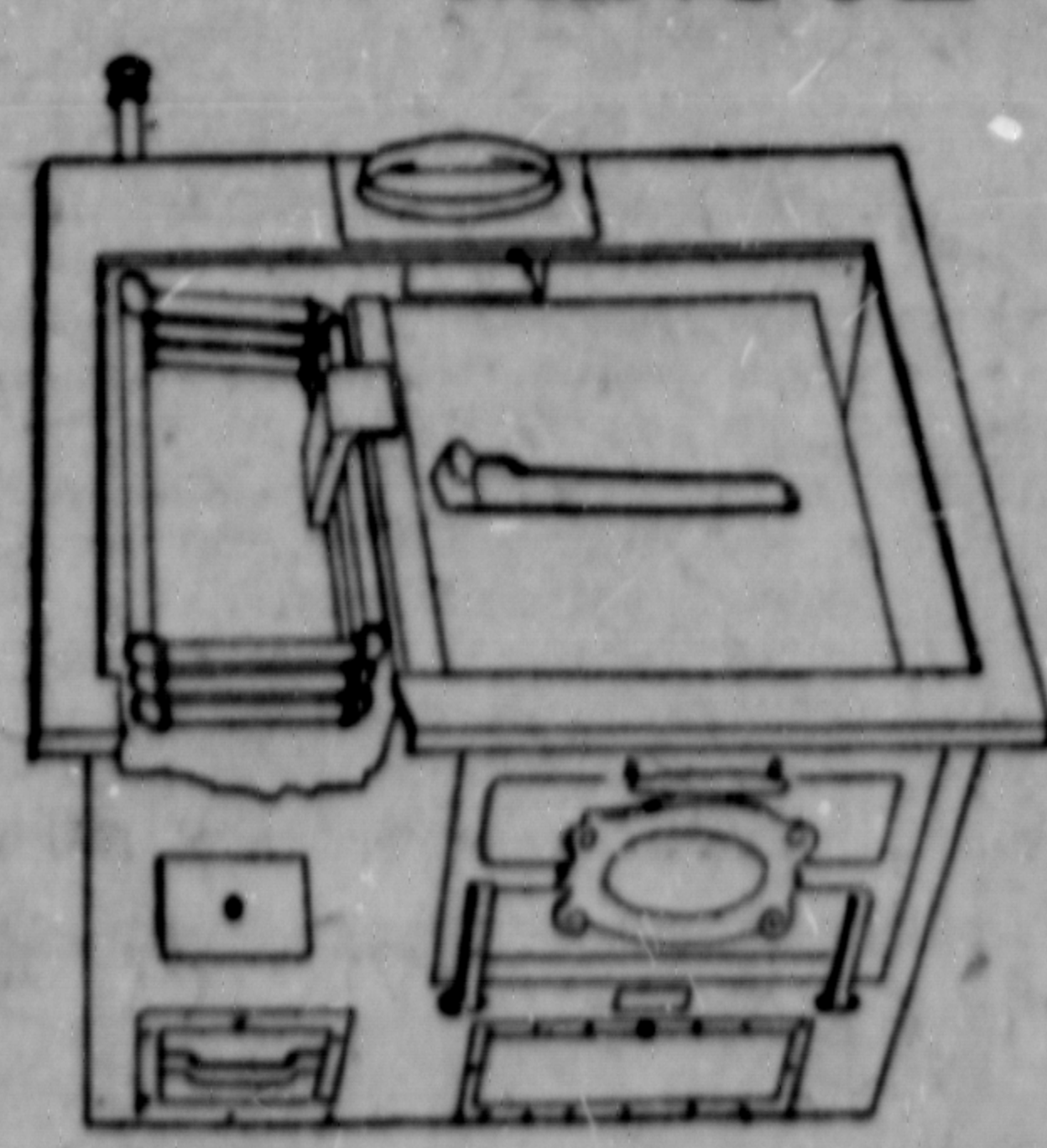
