FAIR PLAY

At the present moment in Canada, in common with most other parts of the Empire, the great cry is for production, production, and still more production. This relates particularly to food stuffs at the present time. Farmers, in Canada and particularly in the western provinces, are finding labor scarce, owing to the war, and with a view to cheapen production of their products, a revision of the present high tariffs was suggested in the House of Commons last week. The necessity for action of this kind was never more great nor urgent than it is at the present time, but the present government at Ottawa, being bound hand and foot by the manufactureturing interests of the East, could not see their way clear to take any action in the matter. This, of course, is only to be expected. The infant industries in the East must be protected. The manufacturing interests of Canada are to continue to get a rake off the rest of the nation by just the amount of the present tariff of such articles as farm implements and machinery. farm tractors, mill machinery of all kinds, oils, cement and fertilizers. For the production of food stuffs, or farm produce, these articles are necessary in modern farming operations, and in almost every case, prices are being raised. With the call for more land to be brought under cultivation to provide food for the Empire at large. the demand for these articles becomes greater. With farm labor so scarce, more machinery must be used, particularly in the shape of tractor ploughs and other modern implements. By their use, a great deal more work can be done at the proper time. Indeed only by their use can sufficient land be brought under cultivation, land which otherwise could not be utilized at all, owing to the scarcity of labor, of which more is required for less modern machinery.
