CONSORIPTION

The one subject which is of the greatest interest in the Dominion today is whether or not compulsory military service will be enforced by the Government. There are very. few people but will admit that the principle of conscription and the placing of the whole country on a proper war basis is the thing to do at a time like the present. In this connection, it is well to remember that the principle of conscription does not mean the application of compulsory military service, only. It has a wider significance than that, and in order to place the country on a proper war footing, as other nations have been compelled to do, the principle will require to be applied in many other directions.
