### FOLLOWED EXAMPLE OF HAROUN EL RASCHID

A very interesting account of one of the builders of the Empire is given in a recent number of the Montreal Journal of Commerce. The Journal says:

The part played by India in the advance in Mesopotamia calls fresh attention to the part India is playing, and likely to play in the future of the Empire. A very interesting pro-consul, Lord Carmichael, has just returned to England from the governorship of Bengal where his knowledge of Indian affairs is proving of the utmost value to the Government. Carmichael was a most unconventional governor, and nothing pleased him more than to wander around the native quarters of Bombay, Calcutta and other large cities, travel on third-class railway carriages disguised as a native, and in other ways keep in touch with the common people. In this way he was able to learn an immense amount about the under-current of Indian political and economical questions. Carmichael also served as governor at different times of Victoria and Australia. He was raised to the peerage a few years ago as a result of the good work he did in Egypt, Australia, and in India. It is, however, as a governor of India that he is best known.

### OBJECT TO PACIFISTS LEAVING GREAT BRITAIN

London, June 14.—Members of the National Seamen's and Firemen's Union have taken prisoner Frederick Jowett, president of the Independent Labor party, and James Ramsay MacDonald, chairman of the Labor party, both members of Parliament, who were about to sail for Petrograd.

An enormous demonstration was held yesterday afternoon in Trafalgar Square to protest against permitting Mr. MacDonald and Mr. Jowett to proceed to Petrograd on account of their supposed pacifist leanings. The meeting was opened by the reading of the following telegram from Captain Tapper of the Seamen's and Firemen's Union: "I have MacDonald and Jowett prisoners. The crew refuses to sail with them."
