### ALASKA MINERS STRIKE

Cordova, Alaska, June 20.—Two hundred miners in the Bonanza and Jumbo mines, the property of the Kennecott Copper Corporation, walked out this morning. The men demand wage increases of 15 to 50 per cent, depending on the market price of copper.

The company was allowed three days in which to comply with their demands, which had to be submitted to officials in New York. The men refused an offer to arbitrate.

The strikers had established headquarters at the Blackburn Road House. Special deputies have been sworn in by the marshal, and all saloons have been closed. About half of the mine employees, including the shop, mill, bleaching plant and construction men, refused to strike.

The increase now demanded is the third within a year. Previous demands have been granted.

### NO SUCH LUCK IN CANADA

London, June 20.—Invited to make a statement as to his intended policy as food controller, Baron Rhondda, president of the local government board, told the press the government had given him ample powers, even should it be necessary to the extent of taking over the food supplies of the country and the adoption of strong measures to check all speculation in the necessities of life.

The controller added that attention would first be directed toward the securing of a reduction in the price of bread, which was the urgent need of the moment.

#### BEFORE THE BOARD OF INVESTIGATION

In the Matter of 26 Streams in the Hazelton and Fort Fraser Water Districts. A MEETING of the Board of Investigation will be held at the Court-house at Hazelton on Monday, the 23rd day of July, 1917, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

In the Matter of all Streams in the Prince Rupert Water District.

A meeting of the Board of Investigation will be held at the Court-house at Prince Rupert on Wednesday, the 25th day of July, 1917, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

At these meetings all statements of claim to water privileges under Acts passed before the 12th day of March, 1909, on any of these streams, all objections thereto, and the plans prepared for the use of the said Board, will then be open for inspection.

All persons interested are entitled to examine these, and to file objections thereto in writing if they deem fit.

Objections will be heard forthwith if the party objected to has received sufficient notice of the objection.

The Board at the said meetings will hear the claimants, will determine the quantity of water which may be used under each record and the further works which are necessary for such use, and will set dates for the filing of plans of such works and for the commencement and completion of such works.

And whereas there may be persons who, before the 12th day of March, 1909, were holders of water records on the said streams and yet have not filed statements of their claims with the Board of Investigation, such persons are required to file, on or before the 15th day of July, 1917, a statement, as required by section 294 of the "Water Act, 1914." The forms (No. 50 for irrigation and No. 51 for other purposes) may be obtained from any Government Agent in the Province.

The claims of riparian proprietors who have filed, as required by section 6 of the "Water Act, 1914," statements of claim to waters of any of the said streams will be heard at the same times and places.

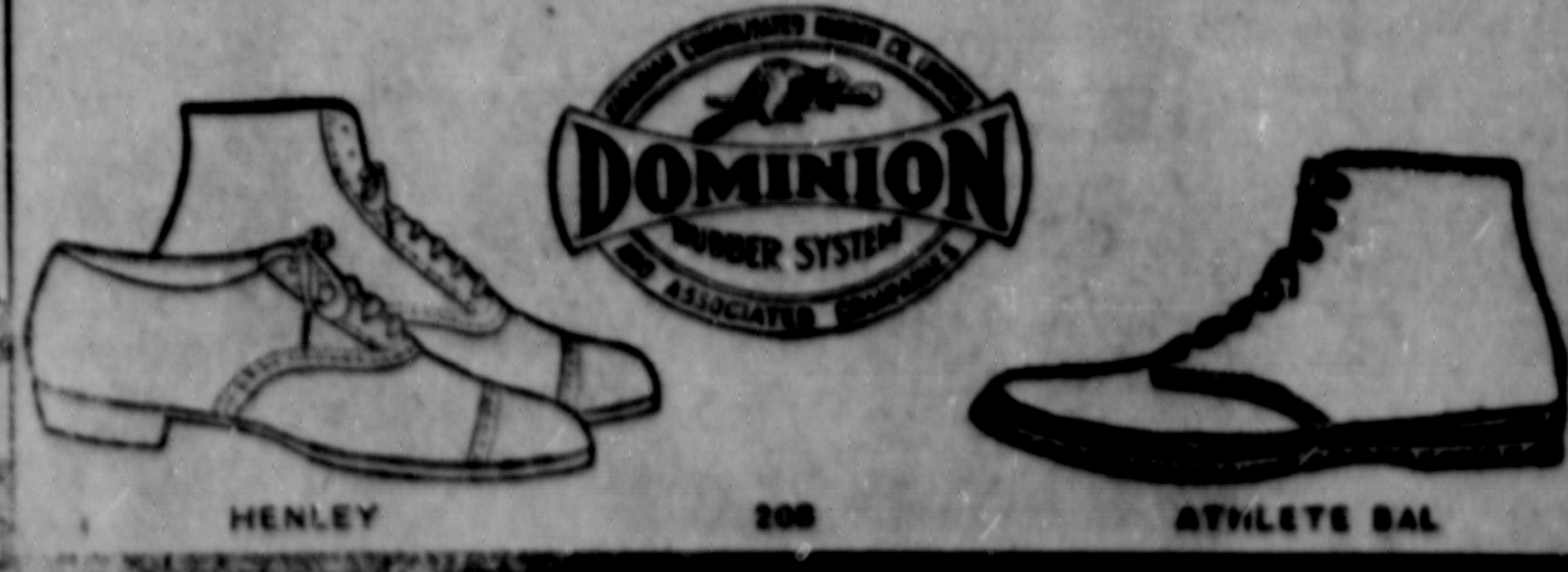
