CROSSING THE CHANNEL BOUND FOR "BLIGHTY"

There has been a great battle out in the marshy plains laid waste in the north, and the war machine, with all the smooth swiftness of efficiency is packing shipload after shipload of wounded men back to England, where the hospitals, warned and prepared are waiting to receive them. On a fresh autumn day, with a landward breeze unfurling the Union Jack and Geneva Cross, strenuous work goes forward on the quays of the Port of ——. A long train of green bogie carriages, enamelled white within, steals carefully up the harbor side, and stops without a jerk, opposite a fine two-funnelled steamer, white and green, with rows of white and green lamps to port and starboard along the taffrail. For this color scheme is respected by every nation that has honor and humanity; it means that only sick and wounded are on board. From a huge hospital, twenty miles up the coast, an hotel under normal conditions, come the throbbing motor convoys which are emptied in their turn. Those who can walk or hobble are helped aboard by the willing hands of orderlies, while the more severely hurt, are carried along on the detachable stretchers from specially fitted cars down to the saloons and berths, now re-painted and re-equipped (for this was once a fast passenger boat where everything is clean and white and sweet. There is the full complement of medical officers, dressers, nurses and orderlies, to care for them; we are struck with the cool silent manner in which they go about their work, never flurried by emergency, always thorough. The place is a perfectly organized floating hospital, complete from operating theatres and oxygen cylinder to the most luxurious deck chairs on the promenade deck.
 All those who can prefer to sit on deck, for the day is sunny, and the sea air like a draught of wine. To them the orderlies bring pillows, cushions, and rugs, and

lastly the cork life saving belts. To one unfamiliar with the interpretation which certain belligerents set on the usages of war this would seem a superfluous precaution; but now these men whom you have seen carried and helped on board, mere wrecks of the battlefield, some of them, the maimed, the halt, the blind, unable even to float in the water, must face the new danger.

When the ship is in the open sea, and the cliffs have faded into mist, every man's dinner is ready for him. Some can sit up and eat meat; others must lie and be fed with milk through their bandaged mouths. The kitchen is simple, run with the same scrupulous cleanliness as the rest. Orderlies cheerfully fetch and carry all over the ship, bringing food, drink, or an extra cushion to ease a throbbing limb. It is a blessed change for those who for months have eaten amidst filth off battered and greasy tinware, to have a well-cooked and cleanly served meal; every such little detail is a help towards health, especially for those unhappy neuropathic cases, who lie staring dully at nothing.

Downstairs the wards are fresh and well ventilated; those stuffy pens which used to be assigned to passengers in time of peace have given way to that space and air which is above all things necessary for wounds. The oily compound reek, called the "smell of the ship" has been banished. The steadiest, most seaworthy boats have been chosen for this work, and, if the weather is considered too foul, sailings are suspended, for sea-sickness would prove fatal to men injured in a vital part. The staff is of that highly trained order that obtains (continued on Page Four.)

BEFORE THE BOARD OF INVESTIGATION
 In the Matter of all Streams in the Hazelton and Fort Fraser Water Districts.
 A MEETING of the Board of Investigation will be held at the Court-house at Hazelton on Monday, the 23rd day of July, 1917, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

In the Matter of all Streams in the Prince Rupert Water District.
 A meeting of the Board of Investigation will be held at the Court-house at Prince Rupert on Wednesday, the 25th day of July, 1917, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

At these meetings all statements of claim to water privileges under Acts passed before the 12th day of March, 1909, on any of these streams, all objections thereto, and the plans prepared for the use of the said Board, will then be open for inspection.

All persons interested are entitled to examine these, and to file objections thereto in writing if they deem fit. Objections will be heard forthwith if the party objected to has received sufficient notice of the objection.

The Board at the said meetings will hear the claimants, will determine the quantity of water which may be used under each record and the further works which are necessary for such use, and will set dates for the filing of plans of such works and for the commencement and completion of such works.

And whereas there may be persons who, before the 12th day of March, 1909, were holders of water records on the said streams and yet have not filed statements of their claims with the Board of Investigation, such persons are required to file, on or before the 15th day of July, 1917, a statement, as required by section 294 of the "Water Act, 1914." The forms (No. 50 for Irrigation and No. 51 for other purposes) may be obtained from any Government Agent in the Province.

The claims of riparian proprietors who have filed, as required by section 6 of the "Water Act, 1914," statements of claim to waters of any of the said streams will be heard at the same times and places.
