WILL OPEN A SIDE-SCHOOL

Room in Old School Building Second Avenue to be Opened for Small Children of Central Section. New Teacher to be Engaged.

It has been decided by the School Board of Prince Rupert to open a room in the old school on Second Avenue in order that the little ones resident in the congested part of the city may not have so far to walk.

A teacher will be advertised for shortly, and alterations made on the staff in order to serve this side-school. It was not yet been decided who will be appointed to take charge of it. Owing to the gradual growth of the roll of pupils another teacher is required in any case.

The offer of a set of bird skins to be used for the instruction of the school children, which was made recently by Mr. W. Keene of Metlakatla, and left to Principal Hunter to deal with, has been withdrawn.

Accounts and the pay roll for the past month were passed among in all to \$765.40.

The School Board meeting was held in the police court room yesterday afternoon, and Mr. W. D. Vance, the newly appointed secretary of the Board, took his place for the first time at this meeting.

C.P.R. COLLISION NEAR CALGARY

Several Vancouver People are Injured, but None of Them Seriously.

Calgary, June 28.—A number of Vancouver people were injured this morning on board of the C. P. R. flyer, the Imperial Limited. The flyer collided with a work train, fourteen miles west of here. The engineer jammed the brakes down in time to avert serious disaster. As a result of his prompt action, not many of the injured passengers are seriously hurt.

CHURCH WRECKED IN MONTREAL

Montreal, June 28.—The church of St. Jean Baptiste on Rachel street was completely destroyed by lightning last night. A bolt which struck the church shocked the sacred edifice and set fire to the damaged building. The church was one of the handsomest in the city. The damage is totalled at \$200,000.

This is the second time the building has been destroyed. In 1898 it was visited by fire and practically destroyed by the flames.

hewed your cities out of the woods drop off, no one notices it more than those who were acquainted with the whole of the former citizens of the various places. Few of the old pioneers are left; but they are as optimistic as ever.

The Future Metropolis

"Prince Rupert has all the advantages that were lacking in the early days, and will be the future metropolis of the West." Seattle, Vancouver and other aspiring cities have almost reached their limit and the march of civilization must tend towards the shortest routes to other parts of the world. The storehouses of Mother Earth are along this northern coast, with its wealth of minerals, and your fast transportation means time, which was no object in the early days.

Rupert's Playground

"We have an adjacent island which compares most favorably with Vancouver Island as a summer resort, and which will eventually be the garden spot for your city. We have sandy beaches there, fifteen miles in length, over which fifty automobiles can be driven abreast, which will ultimately place the beaches of Florida in the shade. Our natural waterway, almost cutting Graham Island in two, runs six miles per hour each way, twice daily, and the rivers team with fish.

"I have seen the Province, almost from end to end, and no person who casts their fortune in this part of the Province will regret it, and must appreciate the advantages one who spent over half a century can notice in this fast-growing city of yours. I have lived here as a baby, a grown child and a man, always sticking to and upholding the grandest Province in the Dominion, and I hope to end my days here. We notice the changes of the Hudson's Bay Company to the days of electricity and the aeroplane. In a few years our places will also be filled by others, but the consolation is always with us that humanity appreciates the work of the pioneers of every country and will not forget the old contingent of soldiers and their families who first hewed out the present cities and constructed the roads and highways in the days when few cared to face the dangers and tribulations of the then almost unknown land."
