AN ARTIST'S LOVE STORY.

Henry Lovins Will Devote His Life to Painting the Soul of the Woman He Loves.

Because she reminded him of the Mary Magdalene painting which hangs in the Metropolitan Art Gallery in New York, Henry Lovins, head of the department of drawings and paintings at the College of Fine Arts, University of California, married his model, Miss Eleanor Johnson of Denver and will devote the rest of his life, if necessary, he says, to immortalize on canvas an indefinable something which he declares typifies the soul of woman and which is perfectly expressed in the countenance of his wife.

Already Lovins has painted four portraits of his wife but each has been torn up as failure.

"According to my notion," said Lovins today, "my wife is the ideal of beauty in woman, and if I can produce on canvas her wonderful expression, which other artists also have declared combines all the elements of soul of womanly woman, my painting will take its place as one of the world's masterpieces."
