TWO DELICIOUS PRESERVES

Hints That Prince Rupert Housewives Can Profit By.
Dried Apricot Jam—Soak one pound of dried apricots in three pints of boiling water for twelve or sixteen hours.

Simmer in same water until tender. Add three pounds of sugar and simmer for another hour, or until it is well set.

When nearly done add a few drops of essence of almonds. This makes six pounds of delicious jam at less cost than fresh fruit, and is most useful at this season of the year when fresh fruit is very scarce.

Delicious Apple Ginger Preserve—Peel, core and cut into small sections four pounds of apples, add three pounds of sugar, also a cupful of water.

Place in earthen or delf pan and keep over two nights, stirring occasionally with wooden spoon.

Turn into preserving pan, add three-quarters of a pound of green ginger (cut in thin slices) and boil for forty-five minutes to an hour over a clear fire.

This is a cheap but delicious preserve.
