GERMANS CUT PACIFIC CABLE NEAR FANNING IS.

(Special to The Daily News.)
Vancouver, Sept. 8.—The Pacific cable has been cut somewhere between Bamfield, B. C., and Fanning Island, presumably by the German cruiser Nurnberg. The cut is probably near Fanning Island.
The Nurnberg evidently eluded the Australian cruiser Australia at Honolulu and steamed 1,500 miles south to Fanning Island. The Nurnberg left Honolulu on September 1 with the Australia in pursuit.

LINER STRUCK MINE AND SANK 600 PASSENGERS

London, Sept. 6.—A Central News dispatch says the Wilson liner Uno struck a mine in the North Sea today and went down. The steamer left Hull Saturday with 600 passengers, including a large number of Russian emigrants. It is believed here that most of the passengers were saved, although many were drowned.

70,000 PRISONERS AND 300 CANNON TAKEN BY RUSSIANS

Petrograd, Sept. 7.—The Russians in a battle yesterday and today captured 70,000 Austrians and 300 cannon in the Lemberg region.

GERMAN CRUISERS SINK FISHING BOATS IN NORTH SEA

London, Sept. 5.—The Admiralty announces that German cruisers have sunk fifteen British fishing boats in the North Sea. The fishermen were taken to Wilsemshaven as war prisoners. The Germans have made a war levy of \$40,000,000 on the Lille district. Part of the British force is now in Mauberge fortress with the French, being besieged by the Germans and stoutly resisting.

GERMAN REPORTS GOEBEN ESCAPED DOING DAMAGE

Washington, D. C., Sept. 8.—A German wireless report says the British cruiser Warrior is stranded, probably as a result of a fight with the Goeben, which was escaping from the Bosphorus.
The Goeben is Germany's largest cruiser. She recently ran into the Bosphorus to escape the British and should have been dismantled by the Turks.

RUSSIANS SWEEPING GALICIA CLEAR

London, Sept. 8.—The Russian troops have surrounded Przemyśl, west of Lemberg, and the Austrians' last strong fortified city in Galicia. A squadron of German Deaths Head were defeated and cut up by the Russians at Rocozin, Poland.

BELGIANS FLOOD MALINES AND SLAUGHTER ENEMY

London, Sept. 6.—The German force left Brussels Saturday for the northwest to cut Antwerp's communication with the coast. The Germans are burning villages on the way. The Belgians have flooded the Malines district. The flood caught a large force of the Germans waist deep. Their guns were caught also. Then the Belgians opened fire with their artillery and inflicted heavy loss on the floundering Germans. The same thing was done at Tirmonde after the Germans had captured that place.
