## CONSERVATIVE M. P. AND THE DOMINION ELECTION

Mr. A. E. Ames, M. P., made a  
striking address in Toronto a few  
days ago on party strife and the  
present crisis. In view of the  
Conservative party desiring an  
early election, this is very inter-  
esting reading, especially as Mr.  
Ames is a leading Conservative.

Referring to previous wars, Mr.  
Ames said they had all presented  
their own distressing situations,  
creating disturbances in the  
financial and commercial mar-  
kets and were factors of great  
and widespread influence.

"But," he continued, "we are  
now deep in a struggle for exist-  
ence such as has only been  
dreamed of, like a dreadful night-  
mare needing only the light of day  
to dispel its terrors. Thank God  
that in this crucible Great Britain  
has, in the supreme conduct of  
her affairs, seven men the like of  
whom were, perhaps, never  
grouped hitherto. You cannot  
name them in order of merit, and  
the order of the alphabet sug-  
gests itself, and the Empire is  
surely providentially placed when,  
in this crisis, the execution and  
interpretation of what she stands  
for is made plain by Asquith,  
Churchill, Fisher, French, Grey,  
Lloyd George and Kitchener,  
while back of them is the Empire  
with but one high and abiding  
purpose.

**Canadian Party Strife.**

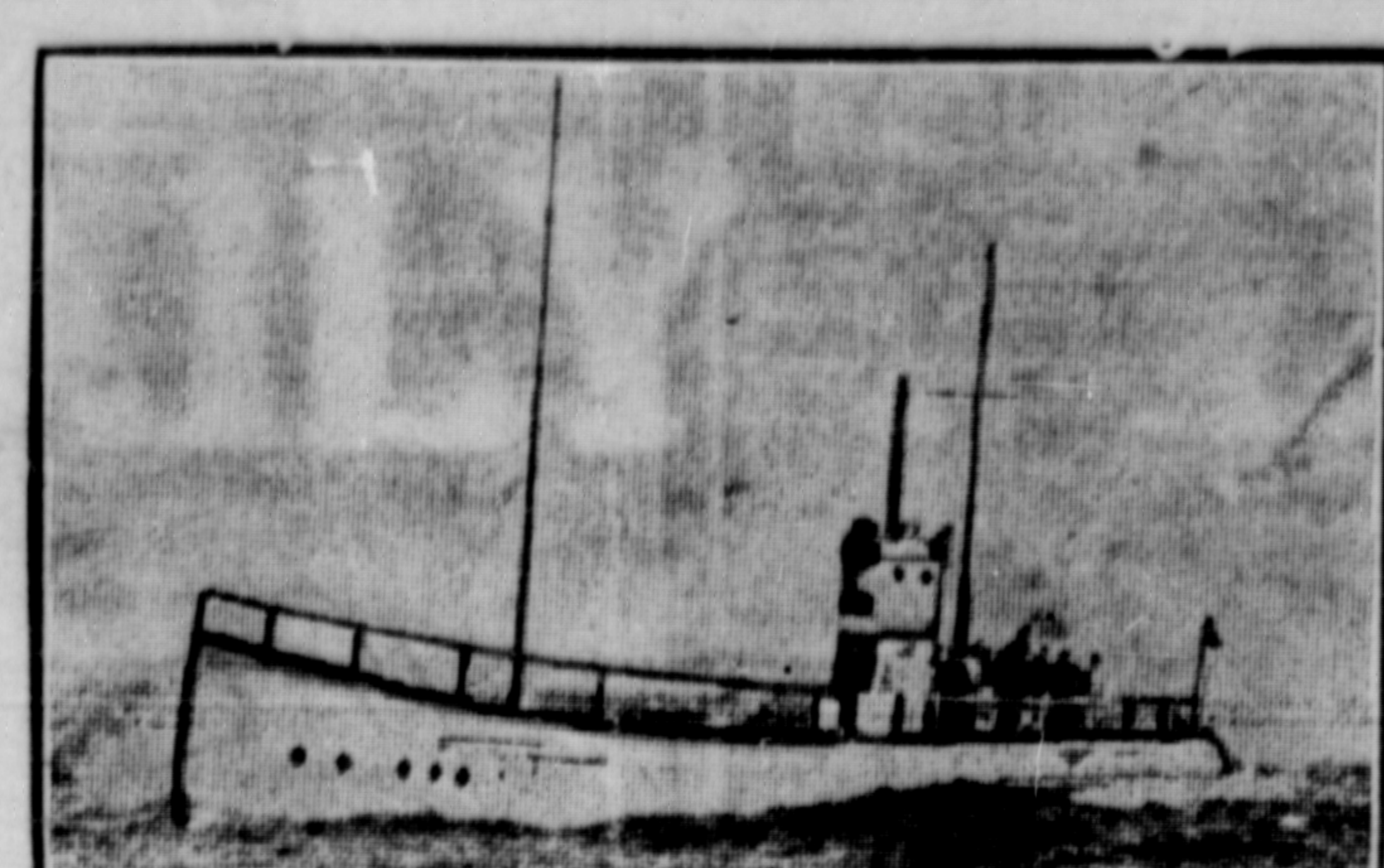
"Mention has been made of the  
splendid spirit of unanimity and  
determination at the back of the  
men in supreme charge in Great  
Britain of the conduct of the war  
and of affairs arising out of the  
war situation. In this respect ev-  
ery good citizen of Canada must  
be very jealous lest certain pres-  
ent aspects of political life in this  
country point to the development  
of a mischievous and misplaced  
party strife. In Great Britain the  
government has welcomed and the  
opposition has volunteered active  
and self-sacrificing co-operation  
until the war is over.

The people of Canada will be  
careful not to apportion blame  
upon members of the government  
and of the opposition, but it is  
plain that if the government fully  
realize their responsibilities and  
if the leaders of the opposition  
fully realize theirs, and both are  
conciliatory and willing to con-  
sult and sincere, and sink the  
wish to secure party advantage,  
for the benefit of the country,  
Canada will emerge from this  
situation with the respect of  
Great Britain and of outside na-  
tions, and, what is still more im-  
portant, with her own self re-  
spect.

"If our political leaders cannot  
accomplish this result there is  
only one reason for it—that they  
are not big enough for this crisis.  
It may be that our Canadian ex-  
perience is not yet broad and  
deep enough to have developed  
men of such gauge as the long  
experience and heavy responsi-  
bilities of Great Britain have  
produced. It should be clearly  
recognized, however, that, as a  
country, we are now placing our  
own label on our back in the sight  
of all the world. Our soldiers  
are doing their share, going from  
every class of home throughout  
the country, but it is sickening  
that we still have to see in the  
public press unfounded charges  
and counter charges of disloyalty  
foisted upon us by every known  
casualist device. Surely loy-  
alty of all Canadians can be taken  
for granted, and what we need  
now is common sense and a clear  
vision of the necessity for an  
united front.

**Credit to Our History.**

"I know of nothing more cred-  
itable in our history than the  
steadiness of the Canadian people  
during the first two weeks of the  
war. That steadiness is being  
well maintained, but it may not be  
out of place to say that if the full  
fruit of what has been done is to  
be secured, the same high sense  
of co-operation must hold, and  
neither individuals nor individual  
institutions must seek to take  
supernatural advantage of the  
general understanding."



THE FAMOUS U-29, SUNK BY THE BRITISH.

This submarine of the U class is thought to have displaced  
about 800 tons, was driven with heavy oil. It had four torpedo  
tubes and two 14-pounder disappearing guns and two 1-pound  
high-angle guns. The Admiralty announced that evidence was  
to hand which pointed to the destruction of this unterseeboote.

Commander of the U-29, which is  
understood to have been sunk.  
He was Germany's most daring  
under-water navigator. It was  
he who while in command of  
the U-9 sank the British war-  
ships Hogue, Aboukir and  
Cressy. For this he was deco-  
rated by the Emperor. It was  
generally understood that he  
also sank the Hawke. Lately  
in the U-29 he has been cruis-  
ing off the Scilly Isles, where he  
sank four British steamers and  
a French one. He was cour-  
teous and considerate, giving  
warning in most cases to the  
crews of the vessels he de-  
stroyed.
