BUYING VOTES

Bowser and his ministers are very careful to point out at every stopping place in their northern tour that they are not electioneering, but are simply trying to find out the needs of the different districts. Hon. W. R. Ross is usually delegated to make the statement, as he has probably had more practice at this sort of thing than any of the others. On the face of it, the statement is absolutely untrue. The Bowser outfit is out electioneering, and nothing else and it is electioneering at the expense of the public. At Hazelton, where the locals were entertained to luncheon, Bowser assured them that he would not turn in a voucher for the cost. The Omineca Herald reminds the premier that there have been other things for which there was no voucher turned in, for instance, that Indian Reserve deal.

The ministers are touring the north to find out what effect the past session has had upon the electors and they are finding that the electors recognise that the sole reason for rush of legislation, most of it crowded through in haphazard fashion, was directly due to the disasters which overtook the government in Vancouver and Victoria. Wherever Bowser and company have gone, and in Bella Coola which they have been afraid to visit, they are looked upon as political tricksters, whose conduct is ruled by expediency and never by the needs of the province.

Throughout the interior, promises were made of bridges and any other old thing that looked effective. Aeroplane services would have been promised if there had been the slightest sign that anyone wanted such a thing. The party is not only out electioneering but is deliberately trying to buy votes. The price is freely stated. At one place it is a bridge, and so on. It is crude and typically Tory, and

will deceive no one. The old Bowser game is played out and the ministers who are now in the interior are so well aware of the fact that they are seriously considering wholesale changes in their plans, one of them being to stall off the election to the last possible moment in the hope that conditions will improve a little and that they will get the credit for it.

NOTES AND COMMENTS

William Manson seems to have devoted much of his time in the interior in an effort to show that Bowser is honest. Why all the protest for protest? Imagine a Liberal going about the country declaring that Sir Wilfrid Laurier is honest. If Bowser's honesty is of such a quality that it must be displayed on the platform there is something seriously wrong either with the platform or the honesty.

If the Mexicans are going to persist in using machine guns in argument, the United States had better get busy and at once.

Sam Hughes is going on a tour of inspection. This suits Sam much better than explaining away the Allison millions. He can say what he likes in a military camp and no one dare cross-question him.

There are to be no more Canadian Highlanders. The authorities tried to do away with the kilt during the South African war but it caused such a shindy amongst the Scotch regiments that the order had to be countermanded.

The Minister of Lands tried to tell the people in the interior that the Bulkley Valley lands had all been taken up in 1903 on South African war scrip. Hon. is making them for now. Since the Kyte charges were made the price on the graze fuse was trimmed a dollar and a quarter per fuse, but even at that the American Ammunition Company, which has an order for one million six hundred and sixty-six thousand of these fuses, is making sufficient to pay a graft commission to Allison, Yoakum, etc., etc., of one million dollars. While these matters are transpiring at Ottawa, other startling events continue to occur at sundry spots in Canada where Conservative governments hold or have recently held sway. In Manitoba the decks are being cleared for the trial of Sir Rodmond Roblin and two cabinet colleagues, J. H. Howden, and G. R. Caldwell. Sir Rodmond would have had a third colleague in the dock only death called him before a higher tribunal. Sir Rodmond and his associates are charged with conspiracy to defraud the province of Manitoba, Sir Rodmond himself having an extra charge to meet, namely destroying public documents, tell-tale orders-in-council and such.
