## FIXING THE BLAME

Mr. H. C. Brewster, leader of the Liberal party in British Columbia, has published a statement of his position with regard to the writ against Mr. Bowser which should set at rest any doubt as to his real purpose. He is taking a step which should really be taken by Mr. Bowser himself if that gentleman has the interests of British Columbia at heart.

As Mr. Brewster explains, it is absurd that there should be any doubt as to the validity of legislation passed since March 14. The premier is not sure when the legislature really expired, but in spite of that uncertainty, refuses to meet Mr. Bowser half way. The latter states that every powerful interest adversely affected by the legislation will take advantage of every technicality to invalidate any measure which is against its interests and in this he is quite correct.

Take as an example the Workmen's Compensation Act. Supposing that during the course of time, a large corporation is held liable for damages running into many thousands of dollars owing to the death or accident to a number of employees. The relatives bring suit to recover what they believe to be rightly theirs under the terms of the act, but lawyers for the corporation prove that the act was illegal and, therefore, inoperative. What is the result? The plaintiffs are assessed heavy costs and are practically defrauded of the money to which they are entitled.

Mr. Brewster is not seeking to invalidate all the legislation in question. He is merely trying to prevent trouble in the future. As he points out, the next legislature will be unable to validate the legislation in question because it will have been elected improperly.

If Mr. Bowser were as businesslike as he likes us to be-

lieve, he would join Mr. Brewster in his attempt to settle the question immediately. The Liberal leader has offered to bring the matter before the courts in any way that best suits the premier, but the latter prefers to travel about the country misrepresenting his chief opponent. Surely no one can blame Mr. Brewster for the zealous interest he has shown on behalf of the people of British Columbia. He is trying to guard them from loss, but it seems to be a thankless job in many respects.

The Liberal leader has put the whole thing up to Mr. Bowser and can disclaim any further responsibility for the unwarranted delay in bringing the case before the proper tribunal. He has done his best for those who elected him to office. It is their duty to stand behind him and help to bring order out of chaos.—Vancouver Sun.


The price offered for votes at Prince George was a promise that more money would be voted to build the P. G. E. to the Peace River.


