CHANNEL TUNNEL

The driving of a tunnel under the English Channel from Dover to Calais has long been a subject of debate both in England and France. In 1876, it was agreed to make a start on the project and work was actually commenced, but a formidable opposition to the scheme was set up in the British House of Commons. The leader of the opposition was the late Lord Wolseley, who in a fighting speech, in which he dwelt upon the danger of invasion from France through the proposed tunnel, launched the famous phrase "splendid isolation" and said he did not want "an invasion of England." He carried his point for the British prejudice against the French was at that time still strong.

The question has again been raised by the French, and there is not the slightest doubt that. if the project could be carried through in quick time, it would receive the heartiest support of every Britisher. Such a tunnel would be of inestimable benefit in the transporting of troops; and supplies to France and Flanders. The distance from Dover to Calais is only twentyone miles and in a few hours munitions trains and troop trains could be landed in the heart of the battlefield, without the slightest delay or danger from German submarines.


