SERBIANS HAVE REPULSED THE BULGAR ATTACK

Bulgarians Occupy Greek Territory—Serbians make Progress -The Greek People are With the Allies.

Paris, Aug. 29 .- The Serbians have repulsed the Bulgarian attacks and have made considerable progress near Vetrenik.

The Bulgarians now occupy various localities abandoned by BEFORE CONGRESS the Greeks to the West of Kavala.

The Bulgarian invasion of Greek territory is powerfully and rapidly changing public opinion in Greece in favor of the Entente Allies. The Greek people are bitterly opposed to the Bulgarians being allowed to occupy Kavala and it seems certain that Constantine and his ministers will be forced to respect public opinion. British monitors have bombarded the enemy forces at the mouth of the River Struma which lies between Kavala and Saloniki.
