## QUITE FRANTIC

The local Bowser organ is becoming quite frantic in its efforts to hide the fact that the government is going down to certain defeat. It proclaimed loudly before the fatal by-elections that the Bowser candidates would be returned with huge majorities. What was the result? A landslide in Vancouver was followed by a perfect avalanche in Victoria. What Vancouver and Victoria did to C. E. Tisdall and A. C. Flumerfelt early in the year will be repeated with emphasis on September 14th, and none knows this better than Hon. William Manson.

The recent trip by the Bowser candidate to the Islands proved to be another refrigerator experience, his reception being of the same chilly type which is being extended to Bowser candidates throughout the length and breadth of the province. Of course there was an alleged road foreman or two to bid him welcome, but the settlers on the Queen Charlotte Islands have had enough of William Manson and his road foremen.

This district will return T. D. Pattullo with an overwhelming majority, not because Mr. Pattullo is the candidate; not because the electors of this district have had much more than enough of the Bowser government and its methods. The bait which was thrown to the Islanders was a vague promise of something in the way of regular steamer communication in the more or less distant future. Goodness knows the Islanders need some such communication, and have needed it for years, even more so than today, when hundreds of settlers have left the Islands. Has William Manson only just discovered that steamer communication is needed? We wonder if he has also discovered what kind of roads his road bosses have

been trying to build over there?

## TELEPHONE FRANCHISE

William Manson told the twenty odd of the faithful who attended his smoker on Friday evening that T. D. Pattullo had tried to grab the telephone franchise of this city for a telephone company. Since T. D. Pattullo has challenged the Bowser candidate to meet him in public debate on this and other questions, all that need be said is that, had all the citizens had as little caring for the welfare of the city in regard to the telephone franchise as William Manson had, the franchise today would have been in private hands. T. D. Pattullo and a few public-spirited citizens foresaw the danger and advanced their own money without interest to procure the franchise and to save it for the city. If Mr. Manson is afraid to meet Mr. Pattullo in open debate, we will be forced to pursue this interesting subject on a future occasion. If Mr. Manson is reported aright, he deviated from the truth in his statement, and, when he is forced to do that in order to throw mud at his opponent, he must be hard put to it indeed. Poor William.

## NOTES AND COMMENTS

"Bob" Green seems to be the most cheerful of the Bowser prophets in regard to the result of the election. Bob's prophecies will be just as far wrong as were his actions in regard to the Kaien Island deal which caused his retreat from the McBride government.

The Journal says that Joe Merryfield is amused at the contention of Mr. Pattullo that Wm. Manson will lose his deposit if the whole district votes as the Islands will—3 to 1 against Bowser. Joe has a peculiar habit of hiding his amusement for he certainly does not look "tickled to



death" these days, and he will look even more dejected after the 14th.

Every report of a Bowser meeting or a Manson tour these days has something to say about the production of copper. Of course the idea to be conveyed is that by some mysterious means Willie or the government is responsible for the boom in copper. The gentleman who is responsible for that boom spells his name "Wilhelm" and not even he is responsible for the fact that a good deal of the metal was deposited in British Columbia when the earth got its final shake-up.

William Manson says that the war has caused a good deal of depression on the Islands. Many of the Islanders have to thank the war for the fact that they are able, by shouldering a gun, to get three meals a day. The most noticeable depression on the Islands is in the roads over which the settlers are supposed to try and pilot their teams.

DOUBLE PERSONALITY OF  
HON. FRANK COCHRANE

Cochrane himself is in no better plight. His health has suffered from these tremendous struggles in which Mr. Hyde always gets the best of it.

It is a long time since either Mr. Cochrane or Premier Hearst was fortunate enough to appear in the role of the benevolent Dr. Jekyll. The devilish Mr. Hyde, meaning the International Nickel Company, has so often put his amiable silent partner to the bad that he has become quite discouraged and never shows up now in the public performance of either statesman. It may happen that Mr. Cochrane is Dr. Jekylling at Ottawa—a rare occurrence—but what boots that when Premier Hearst, his other self, is Mr. Hyde in Queen's Park? Also it may happen that Premier Hearst is Dr. Jekylling in Queen's Park but just at that moment Mr. Cochrane is playing the other end of his double personality at Ottawa. They never seem to be lucky enough to do the Dr. Jekyll act at the same time. They can't get together long enough. This explains why Mr. Hyde is in a fair way to shatter both statesmen.

This dual representation of Mr. Cochrane's, this contending and conflicting double personality of his, works out in interesting ways so that in anything very raw done in Queen's Park one may frequently see the hand of Mr. Cochrane, the mouth of Premier Hearst, and the voice of Mr. Hyde, said Mr. Hyde being generally the International Nickel Company.

This International Nickel Company certainly has a strong hold on the Hon. Frank Cochrane and his faithful henchman, Premier Hearst. It is not only entrenched in his affections, but in his pocket. The Canadian Copper Company, which was the original vendor of the Sudbury mines to the International trust of Yankees and Germans, has names which, somehow or other, overlap into the shareholders' list of the Cochrane Hardware Company, of which the minister of railways is president.

Yes, the International Nickel Company is the Mr. Hyde of the ghastly political tragedy which is now being played out at Ottawa.
