**DEADLY LIQUID IS NEW GERMAN HORROR**

The Germans continue to exercise their inventiveness, but always in the same direction, namely, the perfection of some new horror. While at the front (writes the Petrograd correspondent of the Morning Post) I heard of yet another novelty which had just been used at Krevo. It is still something of a mystery. The Germans fired some sort of liquid which produced the sensation of burning. It was not liquid fire, which is an old device on the Russian front, but something that did not openly flame. A man struck, say, on the arm was not disabled, and on the second day thought lightly of his burn, but on the third day, or at latest on the fourth, he died. This new devilry produces clotting of the blood and consequent death. This is not magnificent and it is not war, but it is particularly German.
