#### THE RUSSIAN REVOLUTION

How great a debt civilization to the Russian Duma (says the "Times") and those who supported its victorious struggles with the 'dark forces' that dominated the court, the record, illumined by recent events, vividly reveals. The outside world knows nowwhat it little imagined before] -that the issue of the war was really bound up in Russia's struggle for self-government, that upon the decision of that epochal internal conflict depended actually the life of the anti-German coalition. Had the reactionaries won there would have been a separate peace, and more than two million Teutonic troops with their equipment would have been released for service on the western, Italian and Balkan fronts. The Turkish forces in Armeniathe bulk of the Ottoman army -would have been available for use on the Mesopotamial and Syrian fronts. Germany would have been able to launch new operations involving Holland. Denmark and Switzerland, while, more important than all, she would have had in Russia a base of supplies which would have made her independent of overseas communications.

The difficulty in the way of the plot, however, was the army which with its leaders was wholeheartedly loyal. The Grtnd Duke Nicholas, Alexieff, Bruisiloff, Baratoff and Ruzsky supported the Duma. How to overcome that obstacle was the problem Sturmer & Company set out to solve. Their solution was simple. It was to hamper the army, to disorganize its transport, cut off its supplies in a nutshell to facilitate its speedy destruction by the outside enemy Protopopoff was to augment this plan by spreading discontent among the people and causing workingmen's strikes. If necessary it was decided to inaugurate a specially-controlled revolution with which to cap the climax. All these measures were carried out. The transportation system was disorganized when winter set in. German prisoners were deliberately sent to
