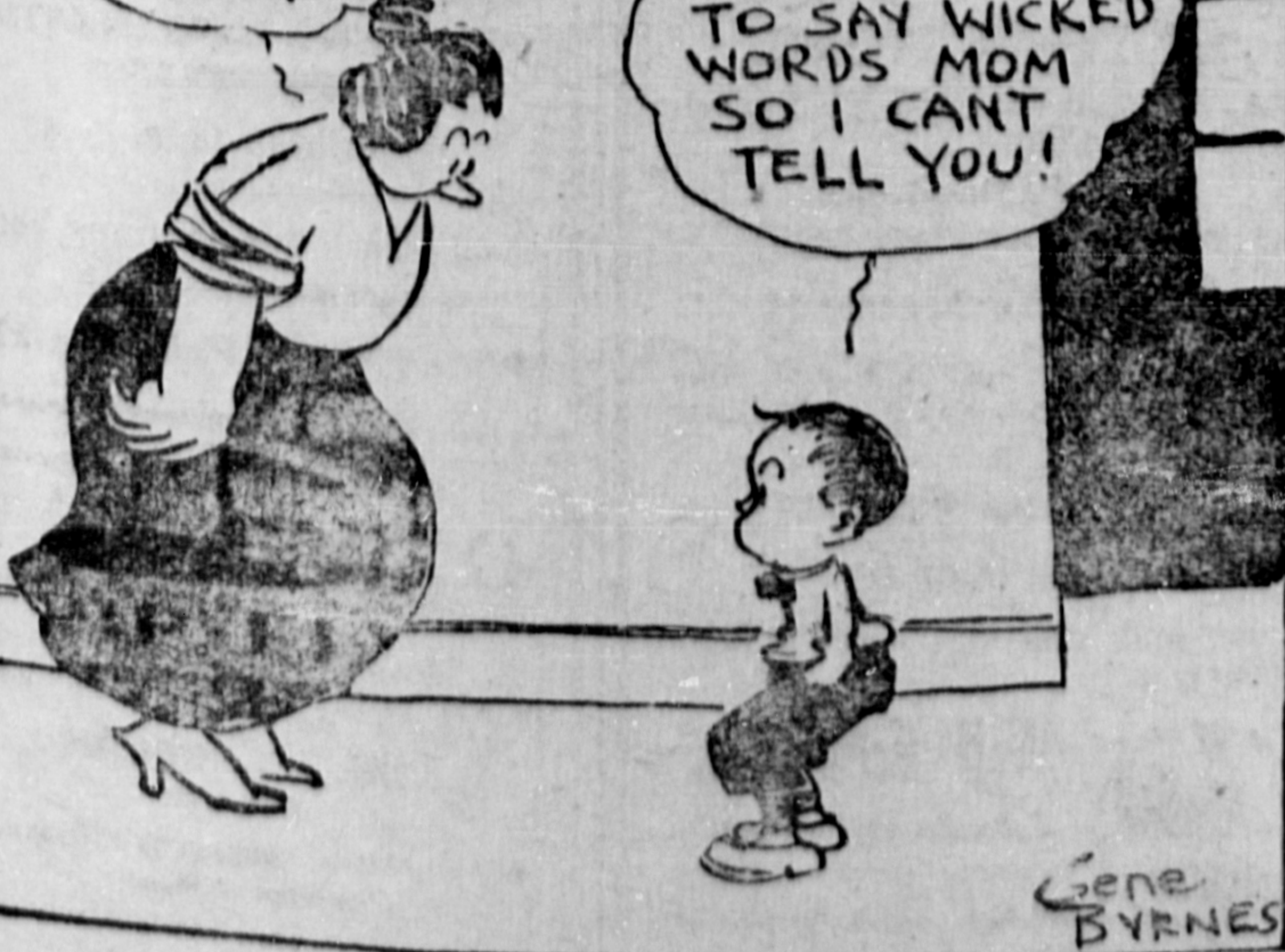

ORE CARRIER FOR THE NORTH

Contract Let by Coastwise Steamship and Barge Co. for 220 Foot Freighter.

Word has been received here that a contract for a 2,350-ton steel steamship to be used in the ore-carrying and towing business between British Columbia and Puget Sound ports has been placed by Captain James Griffiths, of James Griffiths & Sons, managing owners of the Coastwise Steamship and Barge Company, with the shipbuilding firm of J. F. Duthie & Co., of Seattle.

The vessel, which is expected to be ready for delivery in June, will be 220 feet long, 40 feet beam and 21 feet depth. A towing machine similar to those now in use on the vessels engaged in towing the barges of the Coastwise Steamship and Barge Co., will be installed on the new craft. In type, the new vessel will follow the general lines and design of the company's steamer Amur, formerly of the C.P.R. fleet, the engines being placed aft. The vessel will have a speed of eleven knots and will have a lumber-carrying capacity of 1,500,000 feet.

Ore-carriers of the Coastwise Steamship and Barge Co., operate between Anyox, B.C., and Seattle and Tacoma.

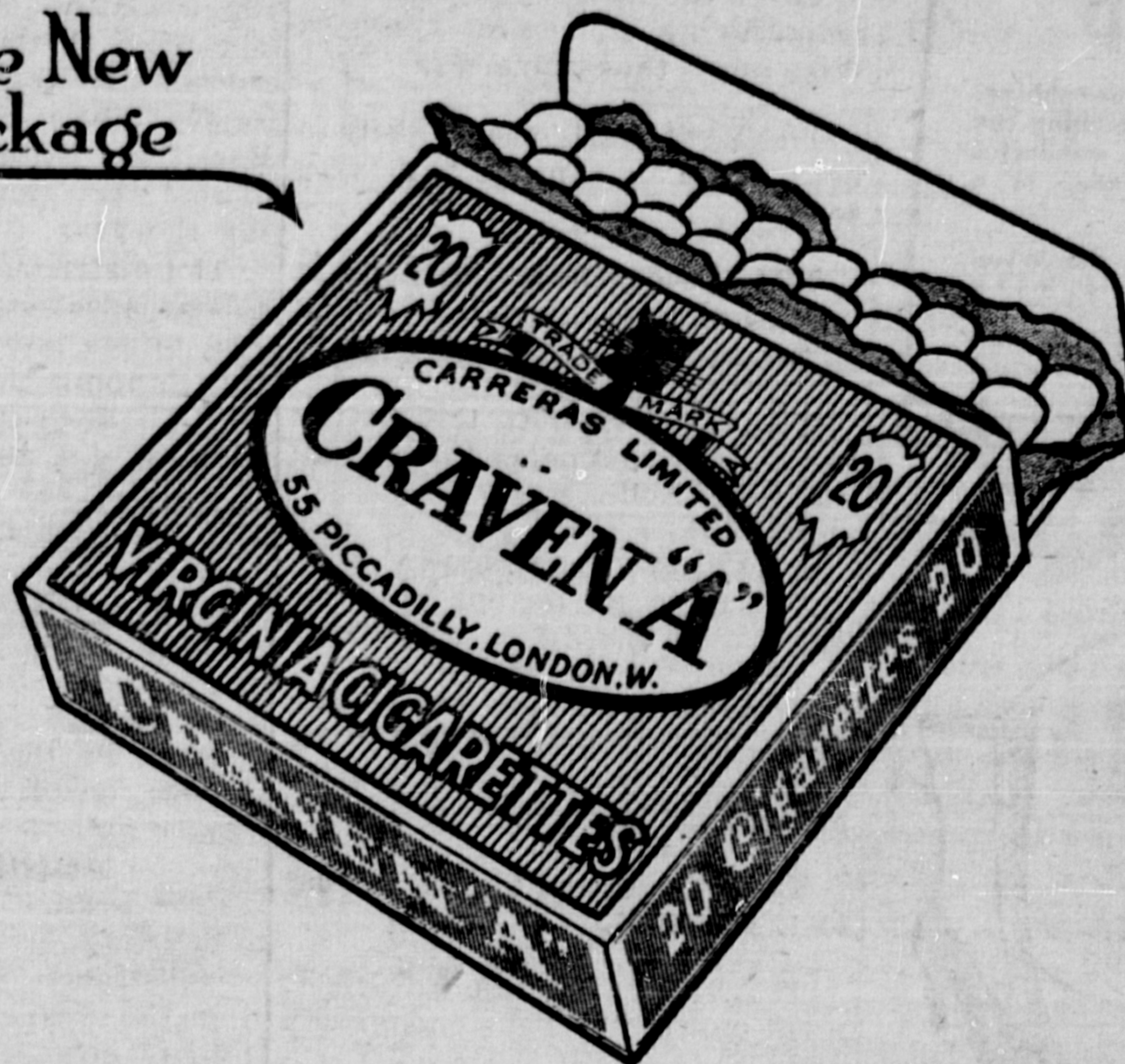
MISS JENNIE TAGGART HERE ON WAY NORTH

FOREST RANGERS

An examination for Rangers in the Forest Branch of the Lands Department will be held in the Court House, Prince Rupert, on March 3rd, 1920. The examination will be partly written and partly oral. The questions will be mainly on logging, cruising, surveying, forest protection, etc., but will also test candidates' ability to prepare reports. Physical ability and good character are absolute requirements. Candidates must be British Subjects, resident in Canada for at least one year and not more than 50 years of age. Initial salary \$1,500.00 per annum. Returned soldiers, with the necessary qualifications will receive preference. Applications to take examination will be received up to the day of examination by the District Forester, Prince Rupert, from whom application forms may be obtained. All statements made by applicants as to experience, education and fitness are subject to verification by Examination Board.
