As predicted in another column the price of fish dropped at this morning's fish sale from 19.2c paid on Sunday to 13.4c this forenoon as a direct result of the tying up of the express service out of this as well as other points. The following catches bought this morning will be held for a few days pending developments and if not shipped will be put in cold storage.

The Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co.'s trawler James Caruthers, Captain Parsons, reached port at 7:45 last evening with 67,000 lbs. after 22 days on the halibut banks.

According to a letter read from the Railway Commission at the council meeting last night, the Provincial Government has withdrawn its application to build a level highway crossing at Cow Bay.

At the council meeting last night, the market committee's report that the Northern Interior Co-operative Association be required to put up bonds to the amount of \$2,000 and otherwise live up to the market by-law was adopted.

It was moved by Ald. Dybhavn, seconded by Ald. McLennan, that the action of the school board be endorsed.

STRIKE REPORTED BECOMING NORMAL
