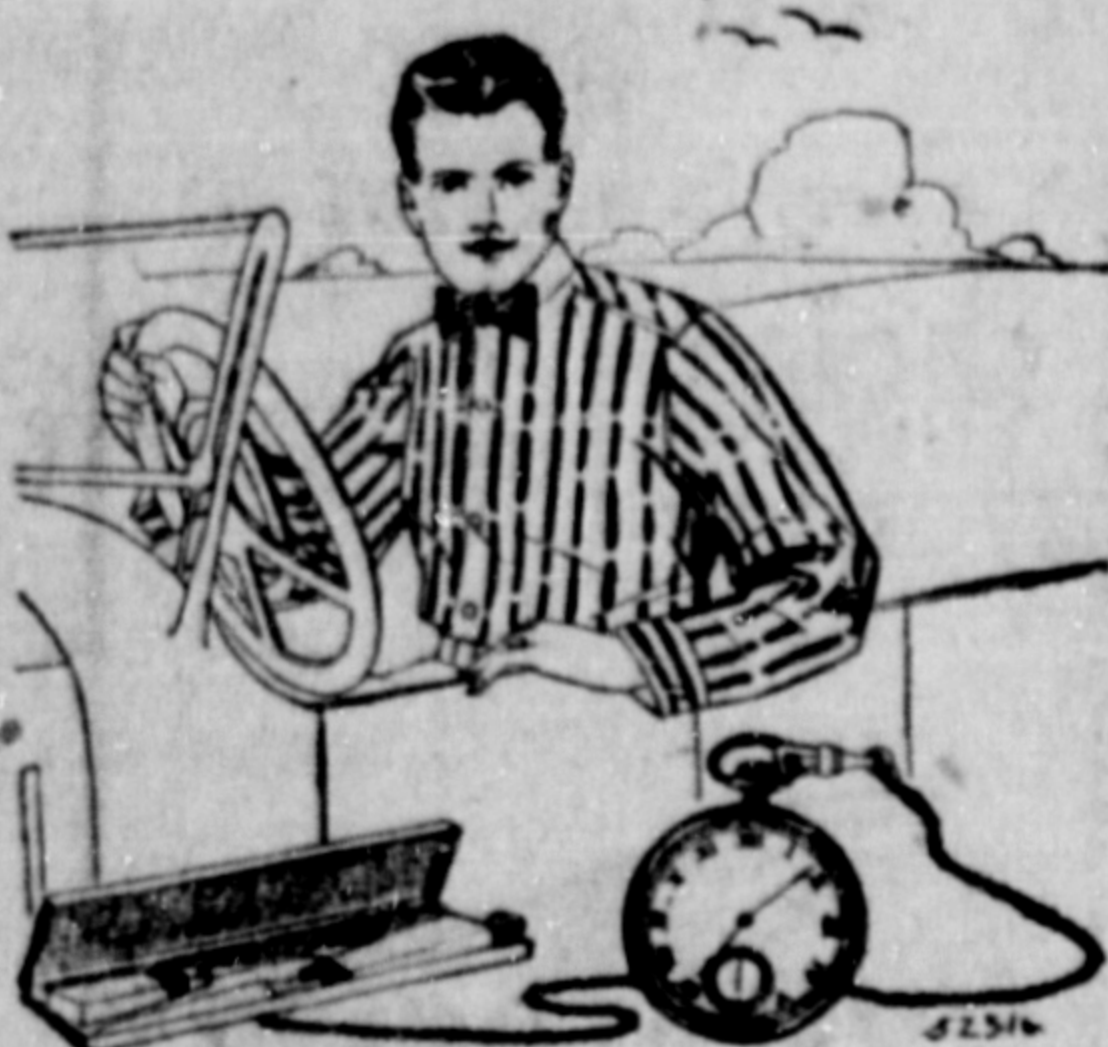

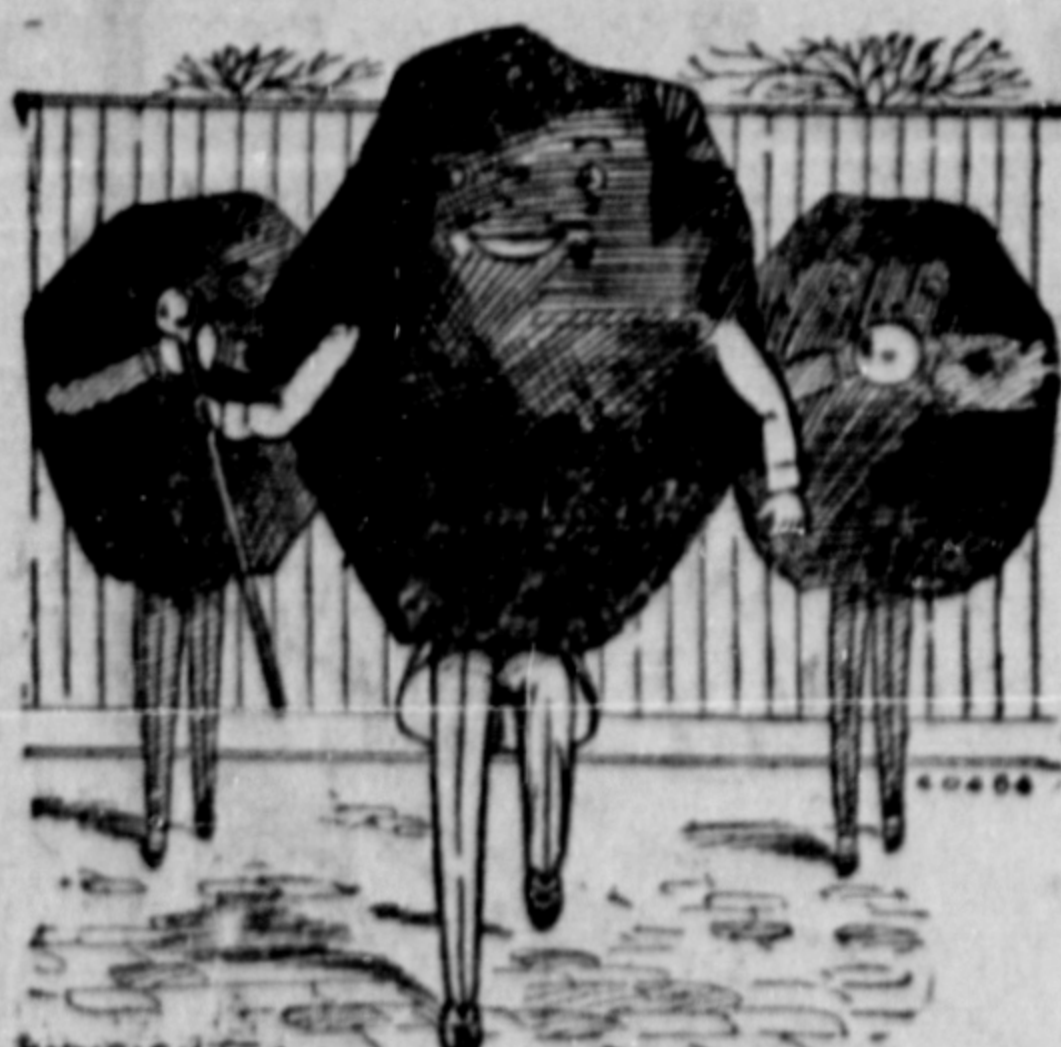

WANT CLEMENCY FOR DOOMED MOTHER

MONTREAL, July 19.—"We will have a million signatures as the result of our canvass with a petition for the commutation of the capital sentence now hanging over the head of Marie Gagnon of Quebec, who was found guilty for causing the death of her step-daughter last January, to 'life imprisonment,'" is the statement made by Robert Bickerdike, president of the Prisoners' Welfare Society of Canada. He added that since the birth in prison of the twin children to Marie Gagnon, the women of the United States, as well as many thousands of women in Canada, are strongly averse to the hanging.

Mrs. Gagnon was condemned to hang next October for brutal and inhuman treatment of her step-daughter, extending over a period of months, which resulted in the latter's death.
