## PREMIER ON DOLLY VARDEN LEGISLATION

Speaks to Large Meeting at Alice Arm and also Receives Representations.

ALICE ARM, August 30.—To a crowded meeting in the school house here Premier Oliver explained to the people the various steps in the Dolly Varden complications, which were finally straightened out at the last session of the Legislature, making possible the present prosperous condition of the mine and the hopeful future for the Alice Arm mining district. The meeting was so large that many were unable to get into the hall and some listened to the address through the open doors. Hon. T. D. Pattullo also made a few remarks and at the close there were a number of questions asked and remarks made by residents in regard to their requirements.

In discussing the Dolly Varden question, Premier Oliver explained that in 1914 L. W. Patmore went to the Legislature and asked authority for the building of the railway from Alice Arm to the Dolly Varden mine up the Kitsault river. The application was made late so, in order to secure its passage that session, a Government measure was introduced granting the charter but providing that the railway must be completed by December, 1918, or the company would lose all its rights.

**Large Sum Spent.**  
The contract for building the line was let to the Taylor Engineering Co. on a "cost plus" basis and the sum of \$270,000 was spent on the road, by the summer of 1918, when the Taylor Engineering Co., failing to get the necessary funds to carry on from the mining company, assigned for the benefit of its creditors.

The Provincial Government was asked to step into protect the workmen whose wages were outstanding. No action was taken by the government until the time for completing the road had expired and the rights of the company had also expired. As the Legislature had granted the charter, the Government took the stand that only the Legislature could act in the matter. It was laid before a legislative committee and a unanimous recommendation made which was fair to everybody. This was enacted into legislation. It provided that Dolly Varden Company, if it was to regain its lost rights in the railway, must pay the workmen and those who provided the supplies for the work of construction. Failing this, the Taylor Engineering Co. was given the right to pay out the mining company and take over everything. The mining company failed to make good, so the Taylor Co. came into possession and paid up every dollar that was owing.

**Elliott Intervenes.**  
A good deal of money was spent, not only in paying out the former owners and the debts accrued, but in completing the line. Everything went well until R. J. Cromie of the Sun and R. T. Elliott of Victoria, went to the original owners of the mine and offered to intervene. They did not succeed at Ottawa so they went to the law courts. The Legislature intercepted this action by confirming Taylor in possession of the mine and railway, thus carrying out the legislation formerly passed and giving all the rights to the Taylor Company. Owing to his action the premier said he ran the risk of being

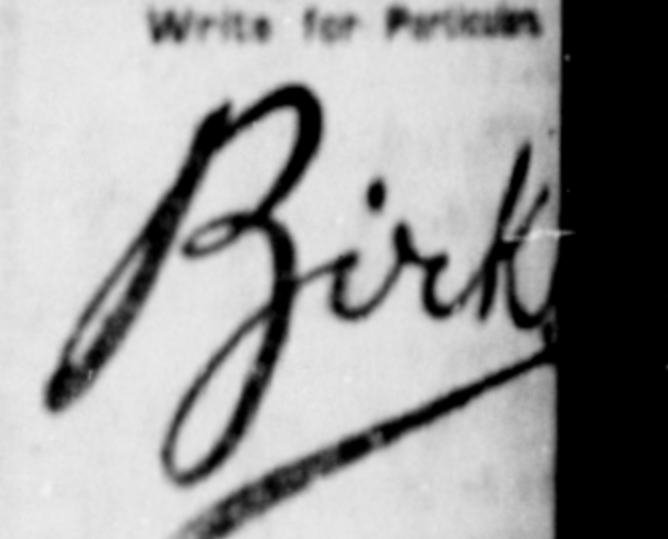
