### Expected Miners Approve the Strike Settlement

Two Shillings a Day Advance to be paid to end of year and after that a National Wage Board will Settle Wage Questions

LONDON, October 29.—The prospect is that the miners' strike will be settled by the end of next week through the acceptance by the miners of the agreement arranged with the Government. The main feature of the settlement is that the miners will get two shillings a day advance until the end of the year and. that in future the wages shall be settled by the creation of a national wage board.

It is also understood that the settlement involves the adjustment of wages according to output.
