**PATTULLO IS ENTHUSED AT HIS RECEPTION**

Visits Up-River Points and Feels Sure of Strong Support from Settlers There.

That the people of Cedarvale, Kitwanga, Pacific and Dorreen will give him a good majority is the opinion of Hon. T. D. Pattullo, minister of lands, who returned last night from a visit to those points. He was accompanied by M. P. McCaffery, who is also enthusiastic as to the result on election day.

Speaking of his trip, Mr. Pattullo said he felt sure the people of those districts would be with him for he knew most of them personally and he knew something about their sentiments. He found at Cedarvale a great deal of improvement since his last trip. The district was progressing, and, where formerly it was small, with the people existing on some road-work doled out by the Government, now they are living off their ranches.

The Liberal candidate had two good meetings, one at Cedarvale and the other at Kitwanga. At Cedarvale Sidney Balfour presided and Mr. Pattullo and Mr. McCaffery spoke. At Kitwanga H. Du Vernet was in the chair and besides the visitors an address was given by Evan Davies and there was a general discussion which proved very interesting.

Mr. Pattullo is very pleased with the results of his trip and says he feels no doubt whatever but he will get a good support at all points along the river.
