## BLACKWOOD on Bridge

With an Advanced Partial One Needn't Rebid at All

Mr. Muzzy bids the same whether there is a part score or not. Actually, part score bidding is a subject in itself.

In the following series of columns I want to point out some of the major differences between bidding tactics when there is no score and bidding when either you or your opponents have a partial.

Mr. New, the avid kibitzer, was watching his idol, Mr. Masters, perform in today's hand. He was sorely perplexed by Mr. Masters' opening bid of one spade on the South cards.

It seemed to violate a principle which Mr. New had gone to some trouble to learn and which, in fact, had been taught him by Mr. Masters himself.

"What would you have bid if Dale had responded with two hearts?" he asked.

"I would simply pass," Mr. Masters answered. "We had a 60 partial and I was under no obligation to bid again."

What Mr. New had in mind, of course, was the principle of preparedness as regards opening bids. He has learned that when opening the bidding, you normally plan ahead so that you will have a convenient rebid no matter what response partner makes.

On this hand, with no score Mr. Masters would have avoided a spade opening because he would have had no satisfactory rebid over a two heart response.

To avoid this situation, he probably would have opened the hand with one club. Then he would have had an easy and sensible rebid over anything Mr. Dale chose to bid.

With an advanced partial, however (60 points or more), Mr. Masters didn't have to rebid at all unless his partner forced with a jump shift. In this situation, then, it is not necessary to distort the bidding just to be prepared to rebid. It is better to bid what you think you want to play.

The first meeting of the ministerial committee preparing for the conference was held here today, with Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden presiding as deputy prime minister.

It is the first time in many years that the northern part of the province hasn't had at least one of its MLAs in the cabinet.

Premier Pattullo represented Prince Rupert and northern B.C. ridings for many years and in the last session E. T. Kenney, member for Skeena, was Minister of Lands, and Harry Bowman, member for Fort George, was Minister of Agriculture.

While Mr. Bowman was defeated in his bid for re-election, Mr. Kenney defeated his CCF, Social Credit and Progressive Conservative party opponents.

In the entire Social Credit government of 19 members only the premier and Mrs. Rolston have any previous legislative experience. Both held seats in the last government.

FIRST WOMAN  
Mrs. Rolston, in taking over the ministry of education, becomes the first woman in Canada to hold a cabinet portfolio in provincial or federal government.

Other members of the cabinet include a clergyman, garage operator, bus driver, school principal and a railway employee.

Selection of an attorney-general and finance minister from non-members is also a historical event. Never before in B.C. have cabinet ministers been chosen from outside the elected membership in the Legislature.
