Musial finished the season Sunday with a .336 mark to capture the third straight title and the sixth of his career. Fain, the \$10,000 draft bargain of the Athletics, ended his

season with .327 average in winning his second straight title. Not since 1913-14 seasons have the Major Leagues boasted the same batting champions in two successive years.


