Christmas Tree Harvest Begins in B.C.


VANCOUVER - The annual harvest of B.C. Christmas trees for the prairie and United States market is well under way.

The Canadian National Railways says that the first shipment of trees have already left the Kamloops area and that many more will follow during the next two weeks.

Most of the trees shipped from B.C. come from the Kamloops and Okanagan areas. They go to the Canadian prairies and the U.S. prairie, mid-western and southern states.

Trees vary in size from two feet high, used for table decorafor churches, homes

Canada's total Christmas tree trade is valued at around \$2,300. with B.C. accounting for about one-sixth of the total.


