'Love List'
Bared in Moral Court Hearing

VANCOUVER—A "love list" containing the names of 300 men, some said to be prominent, was produced as evidence in police court in the trial of a woman charged with keeping a disorderly house in her apartment.

Two morality squad officers testified Friday they found the names in a little black book in a stocking on a bedroom window sill in the apartment.

Satuesque, titian-haired Diana Frew, 27, was charged with owning the West End apartment. Marlene Young, 21-year-old stenographer, and Sadie Wardrop, 42, were charged as inmates.

Names of the "visitors" were not read out in court, but police said some were prominent citizens.

The officers said idiosyncracies of the clients and amounts paid were entered in the book beside the names.

The ground floor suite was watched for a week. The detectives said they stood on an apple box to see what was going on inside.

The case was adjourned until next Wednesday.
