RUSSIA AND THE DARDANELLES

Paris.—The newspapers print telegrams from Petrograd stating that, at a meeting yesterday evening of the Party of National Freedom, M. Miliukoff made an important speech, in the course of which he said:—

"When the end of the war comes and the enemy is exhausted the formula 'without annexations or indemnities' will be particularly advantageous to our enemies, who will be only too happy if, after having themselves levied contributions on the invaded territories, they were freed from all obligations to contribute, in spite of their acts of vandalism and their violation of the principles of international law. I can say with pride that up to the last moment I did not make it possible for the Allies to say that Russia had abandoned her rights in the Dardanelles. The essential point is not whether the Dardanelles will be Russian or neutral, but whether they will be Russian or German. When the Allies recognized our rights in the Dardanelles it was not merely to favor Southern Russia, but to ensure that the Straits should not fall into the hands of Germany."—Reuter.

* HAZELTON MINING NOTES *

Mining in the Hazelton district is in a very healthy condition at present, several properties that were closed for the winter have recently been opened up again, and development work is proceeding satisfactorily.

The Spokane Rocher de Boule mine, situated about two miles from New Hazelton, has commenced operations again with a full staff under the management of Mr. G. Jennings, Jr., formerly of Spokane, Wn.

The Silver Standard mine situated about eight miles from New Hazelton on Glen Mountain, is shipping regularly. This mine is reported to be in splendid shape for a good summer's run. Owing to the increased development at this mine, the power plant has been enlarged to twice the former capacity, and it is reported that the owners contemplate putting in a mill and concentrating plant to treat the lower grades of ore,

of which there is a considerable quantity on the surface dumps.

The New Hazelton Gold and Cobalt Company's mine situated on the Rocher de Boule mountain is developing steadily, the main tunnel is now in close on 750 ft. and the vein at this point is reported to be exceptionally strong. The management contemplates commencing several stopes from the present level, which is stated to be 350 ft. below the surface showings. The company may also commence driving another tunnel some distance further down the mountain, for the purpose of proving the vein to depth.

The Comeau mine, situated at the base of the Rocher de Boule mountain eight miles west from New Hazelton, shipped two car loads of copper ore recently. Recent developments at this mine have been very encouraging, and some promising ore shoots have been encountered. The property is very much lower in elevation than any of the other mines being operated in the district, which goes to prove that the ores found in the Rocher de Boule district are not confined alone to the higher levels.

On the Delta Copper Company's property construction work is going ahead rapidly. An air-compressor, hoist, and machine shop

The trail from Skeena Crossing leading to the Rocher de Boule, Delta Copper Co., and Highland Boy mines is being reconstructed and the heavy grades cut down. When completed this work will greatly assist the development of this important district.
