## UNACCEPTABLE

"The formula of peace without annexations is unacceptable to us." These are the words of the German Chancellor in his speech on Monday, Germany can win "if she holds out." After three years of war, the like of which the world has never seen before, such is the opinion of the German Government, as expressed by the

Chancellor. Now that a definite statement has been made by the Chancellor-his last speech on the subject was so delightfully vague, that the members of the Reichstag could not make head nor tail of it-but now having declared that the purpose of the Kaiser is unchanged, the German people may understand where they are heading for and what to expect.

No peace without annexations may be taken to mean that the pre-war boundaries would not suit her. The speech of the Chancellor may be regarded as so much bluff, and nothing else. The day will come when the Chancellor will have to eat his own words. Although it is a very unwise thing to prophecy what annexations and rearrangements of frontiers will take place after the war, changes are certain to be made; and instead of annexing territory, Germany will be bound to lose some. 
