This high level of price is being attained, not in the winter time, when there is a great demand, but in midsummer, the warmest part of the whole year, when less coal is being used. It is a cause of great concern to the people at large, because as the demand increases as the weather grows colder, there will be then every excuse for the further raising of the price. When we have to pay \$12 per ton now, we may well wonder what we may have to pay when the snow is on the ground. In the Matter of all Streams in the Prince Rupert Water District.

A meeting of the Board of Investigation held at the Court-house at Prince Rupert on Wednesday, the 25th day of July, 1917, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon. At these meetings all statements of claim to water privileges under Acts passed before the 12th day of March, 1909, or any of these streams, all objections thereto and the plans prepared for the use said Board, will then be open for inspec-

All persons interested are entitled to and to file objections hereto in writing if they deem fit. Objections will be heard forthwith party objected to has received sum-
