The forms (No. 50 for irrigation and No. 51 for other purposes) may be obtained from any Govcomment Agent in the Province.

The claims of riparian proprietors who have filed, as required by section 6 of the "Water Act, 1914," statements of claim to waters of any of the said streams will be neart at the same times and places. Dated at Victoria, B. C., this 7th day of June, 1917.


