

### A UNITED PARTY

Arising out of the situation of the parties in the Dominion Parliament and the attitude of members of each party towards the Military Service Bill, a deal is being said in the Tory press regarding the alleged Liberal split. Being incapable of understanding Liberalism and what it stands for, and because some of the Liberal members voted with the Government on the Military Service Bill, lo and behold! the Liberal party is disrupted! Several members of the Conservative party also voted against the Government on this measure, but of course, such action does not cause any such condition.

The Hon. Geo. P. Graham has actually been named as the new leader of the Liberals, seeing as the Tories say, Sir Wilfrid has no followers left outside Quebec. It is of interest to see just what Mr. Graham himself says in his newspaper, the Brockville Recorder:

"The Conservative press of Canada would feign to rejoice! over the conscription bill. The measure is not receiving more than a passing support from within the Tory party. The measure is repugnant to the rank and file of the party and was designed more for the purpose of putting Laurier in the hole than for any other object. In other words the political objective is everything and the patriotic end of little or no importance. The game has all the ear marks of Rogerian tactics. The Tories hold the belief that the Liberal party is broken up because a number of prominent Liberals have decided to support the Government on conscription, while Sir Wilfrid Laurier holds the view that the people of Canada should be consulted before such a measure is crystallized into law. If the Government and its sup-

erals who may vote for the bill have any intention whatever of deserting their party or repudiating the leadership of Sir Wilfrid, they are certain to meet with disappointment. There is no thought, no movement, no desire in the Liberal party to supplant the great French-Canadian in the leadership. He remains now as for the past thirty years the greatest living political general and the most eloquent orator of his country. His keen intellect has not been dulled by age and his physical health is better now than it was for many years during the tenure of his premiership. He gave unity, strength and final victory to the oft defeated fragments of the Liberal party. For fifteen years he brilliantly led a government which commercially. industrially and in many other ways re-created Canada and instituted a regime of development which made this country the marvel of the world. His defeat in 1911 was brought agencies, the most bigoted, unscrupulous and corrupt ever known in a western democracy. That defeat in nowise diminished the lustre of his achievements or reflected upon his reputation as a statesman or political tactician.
