Mr. Noel Peters, youngest son of Fred Peters, Esq., K. C., City Solicitor, has enlisted, and is already in Europe.

Mr. A. J. Watkinson, Dominion constable of Port Simpson, is in town for a few days and is registered at the Prince Rupert Hotel.

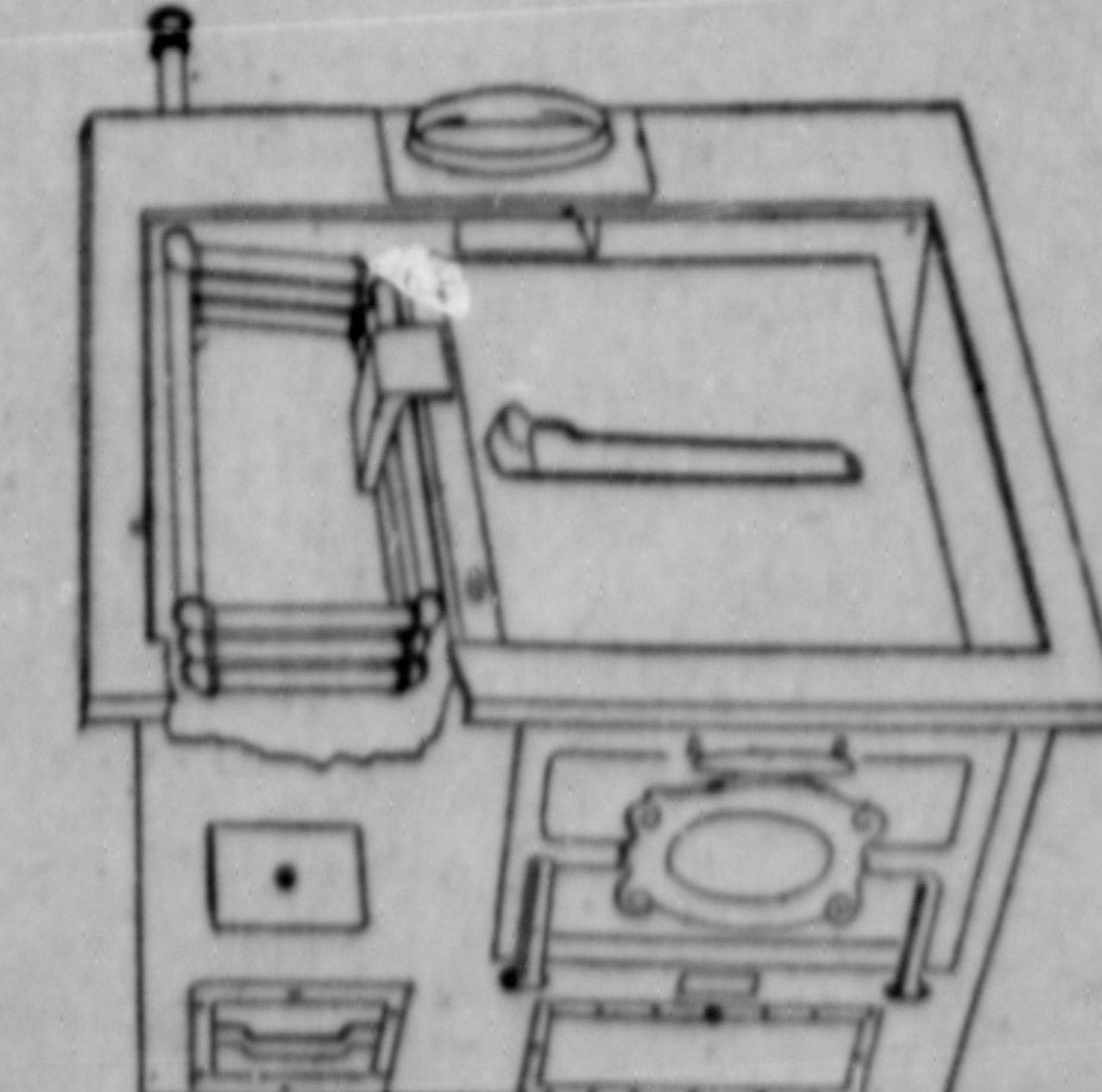
