Local News Notes

Mr. R. G. Johnston and family, of Inverness, have come to Prince Rupert for a short visit.

The police court proceedings were short this morning. Three cases of drunks were disposed of.

Mr. John V. Rittenhouse, of New York, has arrived in the city from the East and is registered at the Hotel Prince Rupert.

Mrs. West McIntyre who has been the guest of Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Elkins, of this city, left on the train yesterday morning for the east.

Mr. M. M. English and party of five arrived in the city from Mill Bay yesterday on their private launch. Mr. English is manager of the Portland Fisheries.

Mr. H. L. Taylor, representing Norlick & Co., of Toronto, arrived in Prince Rupert on yesterday's steamer and will be here for a few days before leaving for the north.

Mr. G. A. McNicholl has gone to join his family at Terrace. Mrs. McNicholl and the boys have been there for the last few weeks and are enjoying a very pleasant holiday.

Mr. A. B. Nichols, of Vancouver, arrived from the south on the Prince George yesterday and will be in the city for a short time. Mr. Nichols is selling mining machinery.

There are only a few boats in port with fish this morning. The Mayflower has got 7,000 pounds of halibut; Lenor, 12,000; Selma, 6,000; Lincoln, 7,000, and Hunter, 3,000 lbs.

The launch Ranger carrying a party of seven passengers arrived in Prince Rupert from Granby yesterday. The trip only took sixteen hours, which for a small launch is good time.

Mr. Geo. McDonald returned from Terrace on Tuesday evening's train. He is on his way to Anyox, but will return in the near future and will then proceed up the line to Telkwa.

Mr. Ed. G. White, of Ottawa, representing the Du Pont Powder Co., returned to the city on the Princess Alice yesterday afternoon, after having made an extensive trip into Alaska and the Yukon Territory.

Mr. and Mrs. Normington, of Smithers, arrived on the train of Tuesday night as the guests of Mrs. Kilpatrick, of this city. Mr. Normington returned home on yesterday's train but his wife will remain here until the latter part of the week.

Mr. R. W. Wood and Mr. W. R. Wilson, of Fernie, arrived on the boat yesterday morning, and left a short time later for Stewart. Mr. Wilson is the president of the Crow's Nest Coal Co., while Mr. Wood is a well known mining man of that district.

A Prince Rupert father was teaching his three-year-old son the Lord's Prayer the other day, when the youngster got mixed up between the commercial god and the Divine. He repeated "Our Father, which art in heaven, 'halibut' be thy name."

There is now a fine road from Terrace out to Lakelse Lake. The automobile is running and makes very good time in spite of the heavy roads, which are gradually being improved upon by a gang of men who are removing the boulders and other obstructions.

A reorganization of the Belmont Surf Inlet Mines, on Princess Royal Island is gazetted. The new company which will take over the existing interests, will have a share capital of \$2,500,000. This is a very valuable mining interest, which is capable of indefinite expansion.

Mr. J. N. Horne, an old sour-rough of the early days in the Yukon, has come back to Prince Rupert on a visit. Mr. Horne is now ranching in Colusa County, California, and was one of the large real estate owners in this city at the beginning. He is just as much interested in it as ever.

Mr. William Manson, late member for this riding in the provincial House and minister of Agriculture, is now working as a timber inspector under the shipbuilding committee of the Imperial Munitions Board. One of his colleagues is the notorious Harry Price, whose services are evidently indispensable to the Tories.
