The report from the fire chief  
for the month of June was brought  
to the notice of the council of the  
City Fathers last evening. The  
report showed that there was  
only one alarm of fire rung in,  
which outbreak was extinguished  
without loss.

Among the recent arrivals in  
town are Mr. and Mrs. J. McColl,  
who have been on an extended  
honeymoon trip to California. Mr.  
McColl is on the G. T. P. shops  
staff, while the bride was Miss  
Margaret Daniels, late of the  
"London." Congratulations.

A communication from the  
acting city engineer to the board  
of works committee was referred  
to the meeting of the city council  
held last evening regarding the  
salary of Mr. Alex. Smith, who is  
cemetery caretaker. He applied  
for an increase of \$10 per month,  
from \$85 to \$95. The recom-  
mendation was adopted.

At the city council meeting held  
last evening, acknowledgements  
from Lieut.-Col. S. P. McMordie,  
D. S. O., and Lieut.-Col. Cy Peck,  
D. S. O., in response to the resolu-  
tion of congratulation which  
was forwarded to both these  
gentlemen by the city council,  
were read. Both letters were  
felicitously worded and were  
placed on record.

Mr. D. Doig, of the Bank of B.  
N. A., Victoria, has been a visitor  
to the city for the past day or  
two. Mr. Doig is the oldest bank-  
ing man on the coast, having ar-  
rived in Victoria in 1884. There  
was no Vancouver, nor C. P. R. in  
those days, and he had to come  
in via San Francisco. Mr. Doig  
has many interesting reminis-  
cences of the past thirty years  
during the development of this  
Pacific seaboard. He intends  
leaving for the south soon.

A recommendation that a bylaw  
be introduced to borrow \$10,000  
for watermain extension in twenty  
year 6 per cent, serial bonds was  
brought to the council meeting  
last night from the finance com-  
mittee. This, it was explained,  
was made necessary by the de-  
velopment of the east end of the  
city. The Emerson sawmill and  
the new fish plant both require  
service, and even now, house-  
holders out there had an insuffi-  
cient pressure. It was agreed to  
hold the matter over for one week.

burden. The men at the front are  
making sacrifices for you. Are  
you doing the same for them? Are  
you practising thrift and invest-  
ing your money where it will help  
to feed, arm and clothe the man  
in the firing line?
