He adds:-"They may not like it, but they will have to lump it, and the Empire will have power to compel them, as onethird of the national fortune is by now mortgaged to it. Nothing in political life remains-stationary, and the Empire must either develop to its full extent or the country will fall | to pieces as in 1806."
