BIG BUSINESS

It has been alleged on many occasions that Canada is, a democratic country. The continued reiteration of this statement, or of any statement for that matter, tends towards its acceptance as a fact by unthinking or superficial thinking people. The absence of a numerous titled aristocracy in the Dominion helps towards the belief in the existence of a democratic spirit in Canada. All the forms of a democratic government are apparent, but between the spirit and the form of democracy there is a wide difference.

Instead of a landed aristocracy with hereditary powers controlling virtually the government, as was the case in Great Britain with its House of Lords until recent date, who controlled legislation in their own interests, in Canada we seem to havve an aristocracy of business interests exercising equally the same functions. The control of "Big Business" over a nation was never more exemplified than the control apparently exercised by these same interests over the present government at Ottawa. "Solicitude for the big concerns, for the trusts and combines, and for the malefactors of great wealth" has been apparent by all the dealings of the Borden Government

Even in the "win the war" atmosphere which has been created by the Government during the past few weeks, has not been thick enough to conceal the attitude of the present administration.

It is but emphasized in the Income Tax Bill which is now in Parliament. Liberals have demanded that if there was to be conscription of flesh and blood, there should be also conscription of accumulated wealth. Such a demand of course was rank heresy and the Government endeavored to brush this demand aside. At last, however giving way to the accumulated pressure of public opinion for their own safety, this income tax bill was introduced. Naturally, con- it."

sidering its origin, it did not attempt to equalize, even in a small degree, the sacrifice as between the man who goes to the front and that of the rich man who stays at home. Instead, this new bill imposes a four per cent. tax, no matter what the profits are, and at the same time supersedes the excess war profits tax. This bill shows the control of "Big Business" over the Government only too plainly.

A letter by Mr. A. K., McLean, an Ottawa member, gives a warning, in view of the coming election. He says:-

Big business captured Canada in 1911; big business is ou to consolidate its gains in 1917 big business won in 1911 through the treachery of professional Liberals; big business has opened its campaign of 1917 with the help of like treachery. In 1911 in Ontario the slogan was, 'no truck or trade with the Yankees, and in Quebec, 'no help in Britain's wars. In 1917 the slogan is 'win the war and slam Quebec. The slogans in 1911 were pulse to a passion and prejudice and against reason, that their objective was outside Canada. The slogan of 1917 is equally an appeal to passion and prejudice, and against reason, but its purpose is to set race against race and province against province, within Canada. Big business did not fight for the control of Canada Navigable Waters Protection Act. in 1911 to prevent Canada from trading with the United States.
