Mr. Arthur McCorkindale, of the Empire Pulp and Paper Mills, Ltd., Swanson Bay, who arrived in the city on Tuesday, is going across to the Queen Charlotte Islands tonight.

There were many guests at the anniversary celebration of the wedding of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Liddle last night. A very pleasant evening was spent, which all present enjoyed thoroughly.

The Provincial and Dominion police are investigating into the circumstances of the drowning of A. C. Leighton off Dundas Island last week. No trace of the body has yet been found, although grappling operations have been conducted.

The Red Cross sale held yesterday at Seal Cove realized the sum of \$42.00. A box of cigars presented by Mr. G. M. Brown was won by Mr. J. Bremner; preserve dish from Mrs. S. Darton, was won by Mr. Chas. Johnson, and an apron also.

The tug Frances Cutting arrived in the harbor yesterday with a large scow load of shingles and clear spruce lumber. The lumber will be utilized for the construction of aeroplanes. Both shingles and lumber are being shipped east over the G. T. P.

The Baptist Sunday School picnic was held yesterday at Digby Island. The weather was just fine, and a most splendid time was spent. Everyone enjoyed the outing thoroughly. The party got back to the harbor before the fog blew in, which delayed several boats.

Fish is still coming in as plentiful as ever. More and more boats are being outfitted for halibut fishing. The shipment for the east yesterday morning constituted four car loads. A shipment also left on Tuesday on the mixed train and it was made up of three cars of fresh packed halibut and one frozen.

The harbor was heard ringing. The people on another boat first got sight of land away over near the entrance to Metlakatla Passage. Others did not seem to know just what direction to follow as was found out by another boat which crossed their wake several times, showing that they were simply zig-zagging up and down the harbor at random.

There was a great crowd at the salt lake yesterday afternoon. Wednesday being the half-holiday all those who were free joyfully got ready to go swimming. The afternoon was an ideal one and the water was just in the right condition for pleasant bathing. However, there was a little misfortune to the Alice B. when making one of her return trips. She broke her crank shaft while in the middle of the harbor and had to be towed in by another boat. It was certainly an amusing sight to see the two boats returning, as the rescue boat was considerably smaller than the Alice B. The passengers who were still across at the lake waiting for the Alice B. to return were brought over by the Narbethong.

KEEPING UP SPIRITS OF GERMAN PEOPLE

Berlin, August 8.—Special dispatches from the front in the Berlin newspapers agree in describing the battle in Flanders as a struggle for the submarine bases in Belgium, as well as in characterizing it as the most stupendous combat of the war.

"The great, brutal force of the initial blow has been parried," writes The Tagblatt's correspondent regarding the Flanders battle. "The mainspring which impelled the German fighting man on was the strong realization that he was here called upon to defend the German U-boat—to serve the mightiest, most promising weapon of his country and bar the path to it with his life. The German troops counter attacked in frightful bayonet and hand grenade attacks. It was the mightiest impact which the world has ever seen."

"Nightfall witnessed the happy German achievement. The foe had won German trenches, had gained control of Bixschote and had carried off prisoners, but he lay bleeding at the foot of the wall he desired to scale."

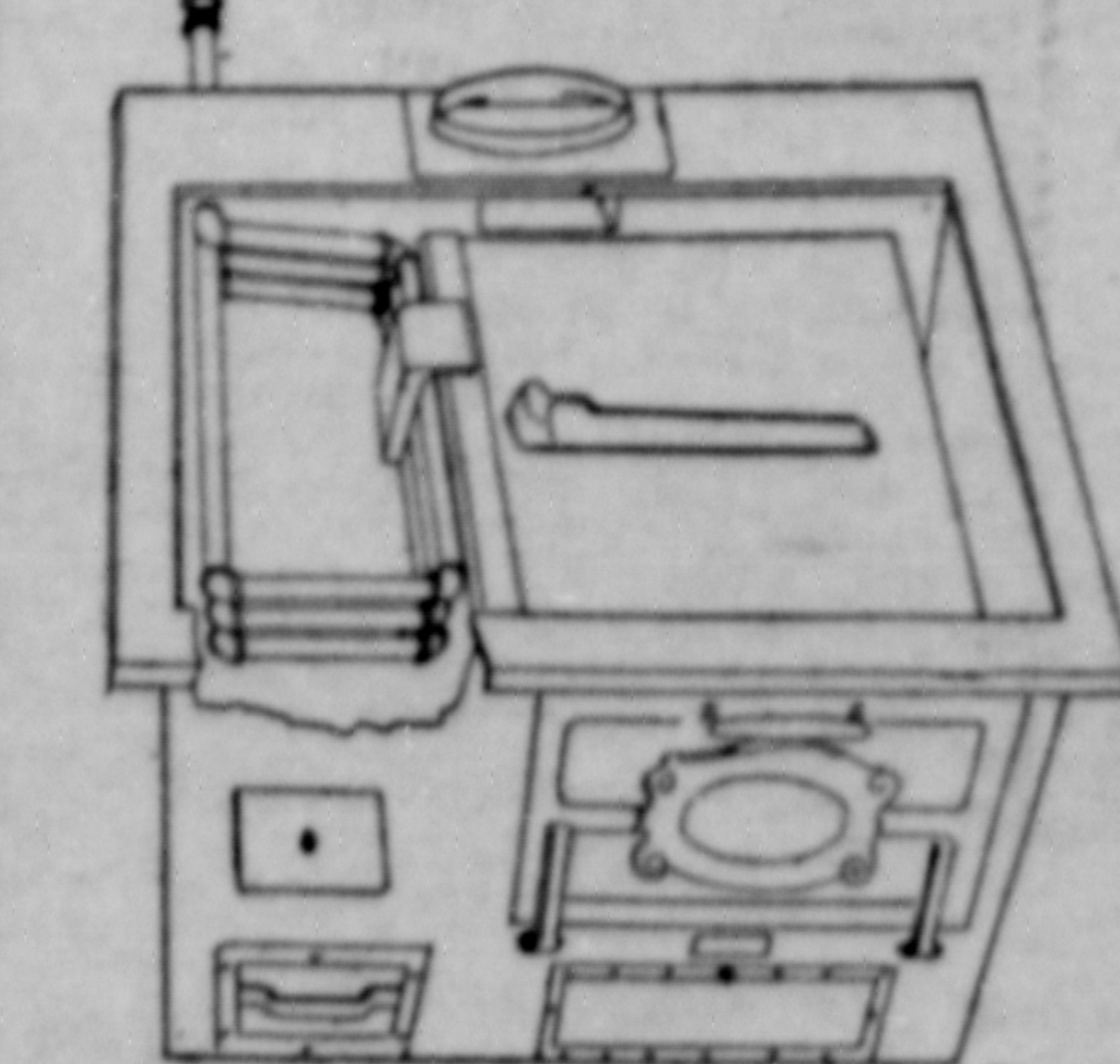
