SEIZES ALL SHIPS NOW BEING BUILT

Washington, August 10.—The United States Government has requisitioned all merchant vessels of more than 2,500 tons now building in American shipyards. Double and triple labor shifts will be put in the yards to speed construction.

No announcement was made as to the amount of tonnage taken over, but the shipping board's records show that about 700 vessels of nearly 2,000,000 tons of all classes are building.

As fast as the yards are cleared of their present construction they will be put to work on the great fleet the Government will build. The yards were ordered to enter into no more contracts or commitments for private construction and to begin no new work on contracts already made without first obtaining the permission of the fleet corporation.

Compensation for the construction seized will be determined later.

RETURNED SOLDIERS AND WASTE OF FOOD

Victoria, August 10.—The provincial convention of the Great War Veterans' Association concluded its deliberations here this week. Among the resolutions passed the following is noted:—

"Whereas we are assured by the Dominion of Canada that it is of the greatest importance for the safety of the country during the war that the greatest economy should be exercised in the consumption and care of our food produce, and

"Whereas it has been proved by the testimony before the Fisheries Commission that a fearful waste and destruction of fish is taking place, in so far that all fish other than salmon and halibut are thrown away and destroyed when caught, and that the bulk of the fish so destroyed is greater in number and weight than the fish preserved:

"Therefore be it resolved that the Dominion Government be requested to take such action immediately as may be necessary to prevent such waste so that the discarded fish may be saved to provide an economical food for the people and that said industry be nationalized so as to furnish employment to returned soldiers.

"It is further resolved that in the interests of the industry that the Government take over by purchase or otherwise of a cold storage plant."

President Duggan declared that the Canadian cold storage system was the greatest curse of the country and should be taken over immediately by the Government. He suggested in this regard that returned soldiers could very well take their part in the fishing industry by filling billets from the actual fishing operations itself to the cannery and storage plants. The returned soldiers could do a great deal to help in the fifty per cent. reduction in cost to the consumer.
