SEIZES ALL SHIPS NOW BEING BUILT

Washington, August 10.—The United States Government has requisitioned all merchant vessels of more than 2,500 tons now building in American shipyards. Double and triple labor shifts will be put in the yards to speed construction.

No announcement was made as to the amount of tonnage taken over, but the shipping board's records show that about 700 vessels of nearly 2,000,000 tons of all classes are building. As fast as the yards are cleared of their present construction they will be put to work on the great fleet the Government will build. The yards were ordered to enter into no more contracts or commitments for private construction and to begin no new work on contracts already made without first obtaining the permission of the fleet corporation.

Compensation for the construction seized will be determined later.
