BORROWING

Apropos of the Canadian loan of \$100,000,000 in New York, the Monetary Times recently reflected the views of two opposite groups on the financing of the Dominion's war obligations in which some interesting particulars were emphasized. One group contended that a loan in the American market was preferable to a domestic flotation owing to the heavy adverse trade balance in the Dominion's relations with the United States, the necessity of correcting exchange, preventing gold exports and relieving the strain on our banks. Moreover it contended that Canada was not in a condition to float a fourth domestic loan


