NEW YORK EXEMPTION BOARD DISMISSED

New York, August 15.—All of the men exempted from military service by the local exemption boards in District 99 will be re-examined by a new board, the members of which Governor Whitman is expected to name today.

District 99, which is in one of the most congested sections of the East Side, was expected to fill a quota of 213. Out of a total of 728 men examined 317 were listed as physically qualified, 33 were rejected and 108 were held for re-examination. About 600 aliens remained to be examined when the members of the board were removed last night by order of President Wilson "because of irregularities."

Can Be Reclaimed.

New York, August 15.—Ninety per cent. of the men rejected by the military authorities for physical disabilities can be reclaimed for the service of the country, according to Dr. John H. Quayle, of Cleveland, Ohio, author of a bill introduced in the Senate yesterday by Senator Pomerene looking for the consummation. The bill provides for the appropriation of \$100,000,000 to be used to establish and maintain reclamation camps throughout the country as adjuncts to the regular training camps. Dr. Quayle said many of the defects of the rejected men were of such a minor character as to be easily corrected and the men thereby reclaimed for military duty.

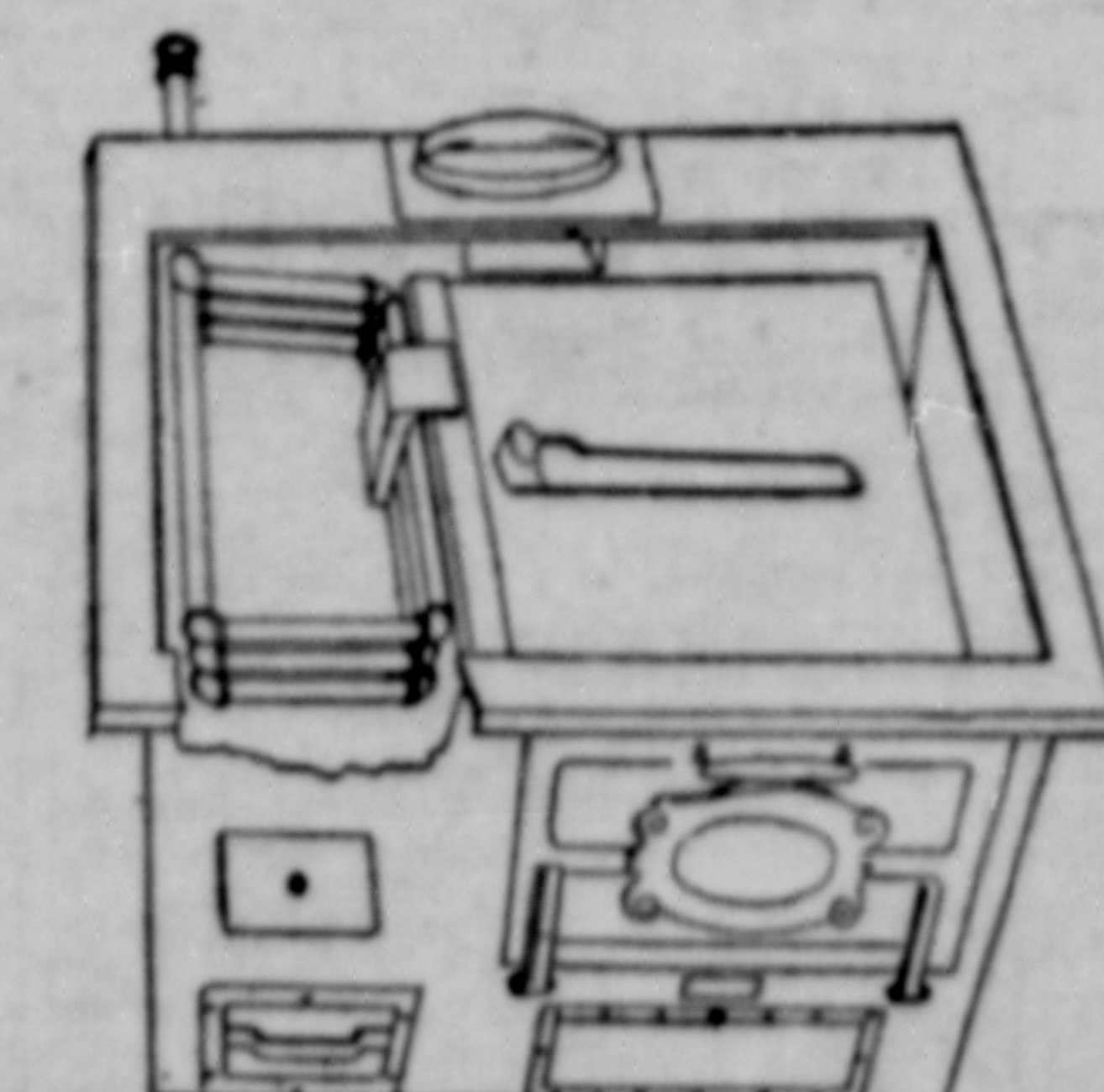
