Mr. A. M. Manson, M. P. P., returned from Victoria on the Princess Sophia yesterday afternoon.

Mr. James Cronin, the well-known mining man of the Babine country, is in the city for a day or so.

Among the visitors in town are Mr. and Mrs. Burritt, of Vancouver. They arrived on the Princess Sophia yesterday.

The New England Fish Company are building a wharf on the west coast of Queen Charlotte Islands. Construction is being proceeded with rapidly.

The arrival of the Venture was delayed for six hours this morning, owing to the vessel having got stuck for that time on the sandbar in the Naas river.

The many friends of Mrs. Herb. Hampton will be glad to hear that she is recovering from her recent indisposition. She is still in the hospital and is progressing favorably.

It is reported that the fall run of salmon on the Naas promises to be a good one this season. The sockeye pack has so far amounted to only half of the usual quantity but the sohoes are plentiful.

Yesterday the Princess Sophia arrived from the south with a very large consignment of mail for Prince Rupert. There was also on board a number of head of cattle on the way to Skagway.

Mr. James Sturgeon, of the Pony Express, was among the passengers for the south on the Princess Rupert yesterday. He is holidaying in the southern coast cities and expects to return shortly.

Mrs. King, Miss King and Miss Stephen have returned to Prince Rupert after having spent the last few weeks at Cameron Bay. A very enjoyable holiday was spent, although the weather was not all that was desired.

Word has been received in town that Mr. Emery Lewis, an old timer on this coast, has arrived safely at Sydney, N. S. W., after having completed the voyage in one of the new power schooners recently built in Vancouver.

A dance was held in the St. Andrews' Hall last evening, which was a very enjoyable affair. The Westholme Orchestra was in attendance and dancing was kept up till the early hours. The proceeds will be handed to the Red Cross Society.

At the Red Cross rooms on 3rd Avenue, the ladies in charge have about between sixty and seventy pairs of socks on hand waiting to be finished. They require to be "toed" before they can be sent off to the soldiers. Mrs. W. C. C. Mehan would like any ladies who can knit to drop in any afternoon after 2:30 at the rooms and finish off a pair or two.

Tomorrow Prince Rupert loses one of the most well known and old time families in the city. Mrs. J. B. F. Melville and family are leaving for New York to join Mr. Melville, who has been there for the past two months. Mrs. Melville was among the first residents here and has now made her residence in this city for a little over seven years. It is the wish of everyone that in their new home in far away New York they will become just as successful and well liked as in Prince Rupert.

Word has been received in town of the death of Mr. J. B. Johnson, late of Ninth Avenue. Mr. Johnson was at Smithers haying, and slipped off a wagon. His fall frightened the horses, who moved off, the wheels of the wagon passing over him. Fatal injuries resulted. Mr. Johnson was well known in this city and the sympathy of all will be extended to his family. His only son is at present with the army overseas, while Mrs. and Miss Johnson are at present residing at Smithers.

been in turn, Liberal, anti-reciprocity, Conservative, Canada first and Bonne Entente is now in favor of winning the war by fighting the Plains of Abraham all over again if necessary, unionizing the government and making Sir Clifford Sifton prime minister. The old outfit is working together again and Canada had better keep both eyes open.

Sir Clifford is getting some assistance in Ontario from certain disguised Tories who are posing as win-the-war Liberals with a union government as the immediate object. "What they want to win is not the war but a toe hold for some pet in the union government of which Sir Clifford Sifton aims to be premier. The conspiracy is further assisted by an alliance of newspaper straddlers whose idea of moulding Liberal opinion is to let no real Liberal opinion get into the newspapers. The movement of Clifford Sifton is represented in the West by one newspaper, the Manitoba Free Press, of which Sir Clifford is the owner, and one newspaper editor John Daffoe, who of course, has to jump through the hoop when Sir Clifford tells him. All the rest of the West is against Sir Clifford. They know him too well there.

This is said to be Sir Clifford's last try at supreme power. If he fails this time he will shake the dust of Canada off his feet and hike for England and a peerage. Meanwhile he takes himself very seriously as the savior of the country. His main trouble is that the people are wise to him. He can't do it twice. Nobody really takes him for the second Coming. —H. F. Gadsby.
