Two car lots of Alaska herring were handled at the wharf yesterday. They are going east over the G. T. P. This shipment comprises 373 barrels.

Four thousand cases of Alaska salmon were brought into port this morning by the Tillamook. These are in bond and are being unloaded this morning.

Mr. A. M. Jamieson, the well known fish man of Puget Sound, has arrived in Prince Rupert from Alaska and expects to remain here for a short time before returning home.

The work on the new addition to the Smith Block on Third Avenue is so far advanced that the new tenants, the Thompson Hardware Company, are moving into their new premises today.

The construction work on the mill is proceeding rapidly and everything is being put in shape so that when the building is ready there will be no delay in going ahead with the real work of sawing.

The visitors are en route on the Alaskan trip and are enthusiastic regarding the west. Their expectations have been surpassed in the beauty of the scenery, and the service by the G. T. P. has been found worthy of comment.

GERMAN AGENTS VERY BUSY IN ROUMANIA

London — Reuter's Agency learns that the latest information from Roumania received in London shows that the propaganda by Germans and others in the Roumanian Army has been of a most pronounced character, not only among the troops but also among the peasantry. German agents have been busily employed in holding out the prospects of possession of the land and urging the army and the people to follow the example of Russia. Continued attempts have been made to fraternize with the Roumanian army. During the past week no fewer than 50 Germans, attired in Russian uniforms, have been discovered, arrested, tried and shot. Thanks to the splendid spirit of the Roumanian army and the loyalty of the peasants all these enemy attempts have proved unavailing. An excellent impression has been created by the agrarian and suffrage reforms of the Roumanian Government, both of which measures have passed the Roumanian Parliament by a large majority. The agrarian reform measure includes the partial expropriation of the big land-owners and the distribution of the land to the peasantry. Details of this scheme, and also of that for universal suffrage, are now being worked out by a special commission for submission to the Legislature in the autumn.

The latest official reports show that the Roumanian army has been splendidly reorganized, and its successes during the past week show that its spirit is as strong and determined as ever.
