LIBERALISM! ITS PLATFORM IS DISCUSSED

frame-up didn't frame as the framers had it framed. The very presence of Sir Clifford in Winnipeg had the effect of the delegates eschewing him right there and then. His past record was enough. The resolutions passed by the convention and which constitute the platform of the Western Liberals, Mr. Stork was in hearty accord with.

"I want it to be distinctly understood where I stand in this matter," said the candidate. "The Liberal platform stands distinctly for the conscription of men. It stands absolutely for the conscription of wealth, along with the other resources of the country. That is the platform I stand on, and am going through this fight on, win or lose."

Several of the more important of the resolutions were discussed, of the problems of the returning soldiers, the tariffs, and the drydock. Regarding the drydock resolution, which called for its operation, Mr. Stork drew attention to a clause which says that "this convention pledges itself to the enforcement of this resolution." Which shows that Prince Rupert may gain something by a change of Government.

"Canada is being troubled today," continued Mr. Stork, "with the question of a Coalition Government—a Union Government. That should have been formed when war broke out three years ago, and there would have been little trouble today. Should the Liberals be elected, I hope to see a Union Government, composed of the best men of Canada and not restricted to the confines of the Liberal party."

"The situation in the province of Quebec has got beyond the control of the present Government; and they created that situation." Mr. Stork considered that the situation was critical and did not want to see the political control of Quebec pass into the hands of Mr. Henri Bourassa. He referred to Sir Wilfrid Laurier as the one man who could unite the present jarring factions in the Dominion. Mr. Stork paid a tribute to Sir Wilfrid as a British statesman. The probity of his character during his long public career has won for himself great confidence.

"With me, first and foremost, comes the platform of the Liberal party," concluded Mr. Stork. "This is a 'win-the-war' platform. This is my political creed."

The meeting was closed with the enthusiastic singing of the National Anthem.
