THE PREMIER AND CABINET MINISTERS' TOUR OF INTERIOR

(Continued From Page One.)

culture saw that which was of great interest to him, and to Dean Klinek of the B. C. University, at the Cronin ranch and the Newett ranch. A call was also made at Jack Sealy's ranch and to Carr's, where the Hon. John Oliver saw finer hay than he could raise on his own farm on the Delta. In the evening at a combined service of the Methodists and Episcopalians, the Premier spoke to the two congregations in the Church of England.

Telkwa. On Monday morning, the Premier opened the proceedings at the Telkwa Barbecue. Telkwa was thronged with visitors from the surrounding countryside, and from Prince Rupert, and presented a very animated appearance. At the stock sale in the morning, the Ministers saw some of the animals which the country can produce. They were said to be "average," but they appealed to the visitors to be of a very high average.

The Hon. John Oliver, Minister of Agriculture, and Dean Klinek, took the opportunity after the barbecue to visit the Round Lake district, where there was some splendid wheat. "The best I have ever seen grown in the province," is how the Minister of Agriculture termed it. The Minister is enthusiastic over the possibilities of Central British Columbia, and from what he has seen on this visit, has good reason to be, too.

During the afternoon at the races, there were some very pretty bits of horseflesh to be seen. Jack McNeill's thoroughbreds were running and gave a good account of themselves. Monday the ministerial party proceeded by automobile part of the way to Vanderhoof, where they will be in the Nechaoo Valley. The Fraser valley and the others in the south could all be lost in the wide Nechaoo, where the ministers will see some herds of cattle. "Some herds!" Thereafter they will proceed to Fort George, thence by boat to the Peace river.

The Significance.

It is significant that this visit of the cabinet ministers to Central British Columbia is one of the first things that has taken place under the regime of Mr. W. P. Hinton as general manager of the G. T. P. Mr. Hinton has always had the greatest faith in the country tributary to the line of the railroad. He has realized that whatever development occurs in this country it will react favorably upon his company by the increased tonnage to be hauled. As a business proposition, this visit of the ministers should be profitable to this central part of the province. The tour of the ministers is purely a business one. Politics or "electioneering" do not enter it at all. They are out to see for themselves and to obtain at first hand information respecting the conditions existing, and to see what can be done for the settling up of the vast and presently unpopulated areas. Mr. R. C. W. Lett, colonization agent of the G. T. P., accompanies the party and his wide knowledge of the country will be of great benefit. Mr. A. M. Manson, M. P. P. for Omineca, has worked hard to bring this visit about, realizing as most Prince Rupert people do, that Prince Rupert will share in the increased prosperity accruing to the province by a well settled country in the interior.
