CLAIMS MRS. STALKER NOT A FIT WOMAN TO CARE FOR MINORS

Victoria, Sept. 6.—As the result of an order of the court granted by Mr. Justice Macdonald, Nora Jean Stalker, Norman Douglas Stalker, Robert George Stalker and Margaret Stalker, the children of the late Lieut. R. A. Stalker, of Prince Rupert, were yesterday produced in supreme court chambers by Edith Stalker, second wife of Lieut. Stalker, and her father, R. Boul.

The order was granted following an examination of affidavits, principle among which was one sworn to by Mrs. Martha Kenny, maternal grandmother of the said children. Mrs. Kenny applied to the court to be appointed guardian of the children to act jointly with the official guardian. In her affidavit she claims that they were taken away from Prince Rupert without her consent, by Edith Stalker and R. Boul, and that Edith Stalker is not a fit woman to have charge of the young people.

Affidavits in reply are filed today and the application will be before the court again on Monday.
