THE CITY COUNCIL AND THE CIVIC COAL YARD

(Continued From Page One.)

reply had been received regarding the possible shipment of coal from Telkwa. This coal would cost \$5.00 per ton with \$3 freight to Prince Rupert.

Ald. Casey could not see the force of waiting any longer to decide upon the matter of a civic coal yard, as there was nothing in this Telkwa project to influence the decision of the council in either direction.

While it was agreed that if coal could be got from Telkwa, it would be much preferable to get it than to bring coal from the south, as it would add to the development of northern B. C. At this point, the lack of any recommendation from the special committee was again commented upon. With their special knowledge of the conditions governing the situation, acquired during their investigations, their guidance in the matter would have been appreciated by the remainder of the council.

Finale.

In the midst of the hesitancy, Ald. Casey came out boldly. "The Matter stands like this, as it seems to me. If the coal dealers come down to \$11 per ton for coal, the city of Prince Rupert will not go into the coal business. If they do not reduce the price, then the city of Prince Rupert will go into the coal business. Am I right?" asked the Alderman. This seemed to be the consensus of opinion in the council. On the question being put, Ald. Montgomery's motion to purchase coal immediately was defeated, while the amendment of Ald. McMeekin to hold the decision over until hearing from the Telkwa mine owners was adopted.

The resolution brought in by Ald. McTae calling for an enquiry into the cost of coal at the mine was also adopted, although Ald. Casey could not see the force of further petitioning a Government which never pays any heed to petitions from the citizens.

PROVISIONS IN BRITAIN ALL UNDER ONE CONTROL

London, Sept. 8.—Lord Rhondda the Food Controller, has decided to take over gradually control of the entire provision trade in the British Isles. The vital consideration in the regulation of prices of provisions is control of imports, and Lord Rhondda is in constant touch with the American Food Control Department on this subject. It is stated that the two Governments are working in entire harmony to secure a reduction in the prices of commodities coming from the United States.

Regarding the supply of tea, concerning which there have been alarmist reports recently, the Food Ministry today issued a reassuring statement, saying that while imports in May were small owing to tonnage differences, the imports since that time have improved and there "is no present cause for alarm, although all possible economy is desirable."
