DRIFTER FOUGHT THREE CRUISERS

The story of how the wooden drifter Gowanlea of Fraserburgh engaged three Austrian cruisers in the Adriatic and got away in safety was told in a speech at the Mansion House, London, recently, by Sir John Jellicoe, Skipper John Watt of the drifter has been awarded the Victoria Cross. The Austrians came across the drifter at sea and ordered her to surrender. The Gowanlea had only a single six-pound gun, but her skipper called for three cheers and opened fire on the enemy. The Austrian guns responded and the Gowanlea's wheelhouse was smashed and her nose more or less battered. A bullet pierced the skipper's hat but he sety laughed. The bulwarks were set afire and the gunner, Fred Lamb, had his leg broken, but continued to serve his gun. Finally, the Austrians withdrew and the drifter escaped. The Gowanlea is a tiny craft of thirty-five tons net. Skipper Watt, before the war, was a Fraserburgh fisherman and Gunner Lamb a cooper from the same Scottish port.

Another story told by the first sea lord was that of the unarmed steamer Palm Branch, which was attacked by a submarine on November 21 and hit in several places. A young apprentice remained at his post although badly wounded. The ship escaped.

Some time later she was given a gun and put to sea again, and last March she was once more attacked by two submarines. She put up a fine fight, and not only got away safely, but also sank one of the submarines first.

"These instances," said Sir John Jellicoe, "are indicative of the spirit of the men, and it is a spirit which will never allow the navy to be defeated. It is a spirit which will win the war, and win it quickly."

Sir John added that the enemy's present method of sea warfare was one of absolute despair.
